AMENDED APPLICATION FOR COMPETITIVE CLASSIFICATION

COMES NOW Embarq Missouri, Inc. (“Embarq”) and hereby requests the Commission approve Embarq’s Amended Application for Competitive Classification Under Section 392.245.5 RSMo. (2005). Embarq is seeking competitive classification for all residential services, other than exchange access services, offered in its Ft. Leonard Wood, Henrietta, Lone Jack, St. Robert, and Waynesville exchanges. In addition, Embarq is seeking competitive classification for all business services, other than exchange access services, offered in its Lone Jack, Odessa, Pleasant Hill, and Warrensburg exchanges. In support of its Amended Application, Embarq states as follows:

1. Embarq is a public utility, and a telecommunications company, as those terms are defined in Section 386.020(42) and (51), RSMo 2000. Embarq is a large incumbent local exchange telecommunications company and is subject to Price Cap Regulation under Section 392.245.

2. Missouri Revised Statutes §392.245.5 (2005) allows carriers subject to Price Cap Regulation to seek competitive classification for each telecommunications service offered to business and residential customers, other than exchange access service, in any exchange in which

at least two non-affiliated entities are providing basic local telecommunications service to customers within the exchange.

3. Embarq faces growing and intense residential competition from two or more non-affiliated entities in its Ft. Leonard Wood, Henrietta, Lone Jack, St. Robert, and Waynesville exchanges. Furthermore, Embarq faces growing business competition from two or more non-affiliated entities in its Lone Jack, Odessa, Pleasant Hill, and Warrensburg exchanges. More specifically, Embarq faces competition from numerous non-affiliated wireless providers and from wireline carriers using their own facilities, in whole or in part, to provide basic local telecommunications services.

4. Section 392.245.5(1) RSMo. (2005) recognizes that commercial mobile service providers shall be considered as entities providing basic local telecommunications service, provided that only one such non-affiliated provider shall be considered as providing basic local telecommunications service within an exchange. Embarq has numerous non-affiliated wireless providers operating in its Ft. Leonard Wood, Henrietta, Lone Jack, Odessa, Pleasant Hill, St. Robert, Warrensburg and Waynesville exchanges providing basic local telecommunications service. The following wireless carriers are each providing basic local telecommunications service to business and residential customers in Embarq's Ft. Leonard Wood, Henrietta, Lone Jack, Odessa, Pleasant Hill, St. Robert, Warrensburg and Waynesville exchanges: Sprint Nextel (www.sprint.com), AT&T Wireless (www.wireless.att.com), Verizon (www.verizon.com), Alltel (www.alltel.com), T-Mobile (www.t-mobile.com), and US Cellular (www.uscc.com).

5. Section 392.245.5(2) RSMo (2005), recognizes any entity providing local voice service in whole or in part over telecommunications facilities it owns as an entity that provides basic local telecommunications services in competition with Embarq. AT&T Communications

of the Southwest ("AT&T"), Fidelity Communications Services I ("Fidelity"), EXOP of Missouri, Inc. ("EXOP"), Granite Telecommunications, LLC ("Granite") Time Warner Cable ("Time Warner"), Comcast Phone of Missouri, LLC ("Comcast"), Socket Telecom, LLC ("Socket") and MMC Telephony of Missouri, Inc. ("Mediacom") each offer local phone service in direct competition with Embark. Embark has experienced residential customer loss in its Ft. Leonard Wood, Henrietta, Lone Jack, St. Robert, and Waynesville exchanges as a direct result of competitive entry by Comcast, Fidelity, EXOP, Mediacom and Time Warner. Embark has experienced business customer loss in its Lone Jack, Odessa, Pleasant Hill, and Warrensburg exchanges as a direct result of competitive entry by Time Warner, Comcast, AT&T, and Socket.


6. Embark's Amended Application for Competitive Classification does not request any price changes. In fact, Embark acknowledges that all rates currently in effect for these exchanges will remain in effect until such time Embark files a tariff requesting a price change. Under current law, Embark will be required to file tariffs for any future price changes, either increases or decreases, associated with these exchanges which will continue to require Commission approval. Furthermore, Embark will be required to notify its customers of any future price increase.

WHEREFORE Embark respectfully requests the Commission approve Embark's Amended Application for Competitive Classification pursuant to Section 392.245.5 RSMo (2005). Embark has identified that at least two non-affiliated entities that are providing basic local telecommunications service to residential customers within its Ft. Leonard Wood, Henrietta, Lone Jack, St. Robert, and Waynesville exchanges. Embark has identified that at least two non-affiliated entities are providing basic local telecommunications service to business customers within its Lone Jack, Odessa, Pleasant Hill, and Warrensburg exchanges. Embark's

Amended Application meets the statutory requirements for competitive classification and should become effective in no more than 30 days.
