INTERVENE

On April 23, 2009, Charter Fiberlink-Missouri, LLC, filed an application to intervene, indicating it opposes AT&T Missouri's application for waiver and motion for expedited treatment.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties ten days to respond to any pleading unless otherwise ordered by the Commission. That means any response to Charter Fiberlink's application to intervene would be due no later than May 4. However, since AT&T has asked the Commission to expedite consideration of its application for waiver, the Commission will shorten the time for response to Charter Fiberlink's application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Any party that wishes to respond to Charter Fiberlink-Missouri, LLC's Application to Intervene shall do so no later than April 30, 2009.

2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
