2	(Written Entries of Appearance filed.)
3	JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. We'll go on the
4	record.
5	Good morning. We're here in the Matter of
6	MC-2002-11, Director of the Manufactured Housing and
7	Modular Units Program of the Public Service Commission,
8	Complainant, versus I-70 Mobile Home Sales, Inc. doing
9	business as I-70 Mobile Home Sales and I-70 Mobile Home
10	Sales, Inc. doing business as Interstate Homes,
11	Respondent.
12	We'll go ahead and take oral entries of
13	appearance at this time. Who is here for the Director?
14	MR. BATES: Good morning, Your Honor. My name
15	is Bruce H. Bates, and I'm an attorney with the
16	Missouri Public Service Commission.
17	I am representing the Director in this matter.
18	And my address is Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City,
19	Missouri 65102.
20	JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr. Bates.

And who is present by Respondent? 21

MR. HARRISON: For Respondent I am present. 22

Don Harrison, president of I-70 Mobile Home Sales and 23

24 Interstate Homes, a secondary location that we have.

25 And my address is P. O. Box 426, O'Fallon,

- 1 Missouri 63366.
- 2 I'm here to answer any questions that they may
- 3 have on this.
- 4 JUDGE THOMPSON: And, Mr. Harrison, are you an
- 5 attorney?
- 6 MR. HARRISON: No, sir.
- 7 JUDGE THOMPSON: Just -- does Respondent have
- 8 an attorney, as far as you know?
- 9 MR. HARRISON: I didn't know I even needed an
- 10 attorney.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Well --
- 12 MR. HARRISON: I called here and they said I
- 13 didn't.
- 14 JUDGE THOMPSON: I see. The reason I raise
- 15 the point is because evidently Respondent is a
- 16 corporation; is that correct?
- 17 MR. HARRISON: Yes.
- 18 JUDGE THOMPSON: Doing business in corporate
- 19 form. And, of course, a corporation is a legal person,
- 20 but nonetheless a fictitious person.
- 21 And so a corporation does not have the
- 22 privilege that a natural real person has of
- 23 representing itself in Court.
- 24 A corporation as fictitious entity has to be
- 25 represented by an attorney. So I would bring that to

- 1 your attention so that for further proceedings in this
- 2 case you can retain counsel.
- But we can certainly go ahead with what we're
- 4 here for today, which is primarily two things.
- 5 No. 1 is the bring the parties together to see
- 6 whether or not a resolution can be negotiation. Now, I
- 7 understand in this case there has been mediation; is
- 8 that correct?
- 9 MR. HARRISON: Yes, sir.
- 10 JUDGE THOMPSON: Mediation has failed and --
- MR. HARRISON: No, it hasn't failed.
- 12 JUDGE THOMPSON: It has not failed.
- 13 Okay. So there's a difference of opinion on
- 14 that point.
- MR. HARRISON: No, it did not -- it's not a
- 16 difference of opinion. It hasn't failed.
- 17 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. Thank you, sir.
- The second reason we're here is so that a
- 19 procedural schedule can be prepared. And by bringing
- 20 you together with your calendars you can select
- 21 appropriate dates.
- Mr. Bates knows what sort of dates we need,
- 23 and he will assist you in doing that.
- Do we have any matters that we need to take up
- 25 at this time?

- 1 MR. BATES: Not for the Director, thank you.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Very well.
- Respondent?
- 4 MR. HARRISON: I might have a matter as to our
- 5 mediation that we had. Our mediation -- there was an
- 6 understanding that -- I told them they -- I'm
- 7 not -- didn't feel that I was at fault. No one could
- 8 prove that I was at fault in this situation.
- 9 But rather than resolve the situation, I hired
- 10 an engineer -- had engineering work. And I said either
- 11 we can do the work or we'll have an outside contractor
- 12 do the work for the problem with the particular home.
- 13 In that case everyone had agreed. And in that
- 14 agreement all we had to do was to get in the house.
- 15 I told them I had trouble. The woman
- 16 wouldn't -- and the husband would not let us in their
- 17 home to do the work.
- 18 So the Public Service Commission agreed that
- 19 since we're having such a problem, that they could
- 20 possibly do it.
- 21 And there's no way that I can solve the
- 22 problem if they won't let me in the house to make the
- 23 necessary repairs.
- 24 And that is the breakdown on the mediation.
- 25 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. I -- I appreciate

- 1 that.
- 2 I also see that there has been no Staff
- 3 investigation in this case. And, of course, this is
- 4 Staff's complaint so perhaps a Staff investigation
- 5 would be fruitless.
- 6 Well, I'll let you guys go ahead and talk and
- 7 work out a procedural schedule. I don't know whether
- 8 there's any possibility that a settlement can be
- 9 reached at this time, but I hope you will explore that.
- 10 But I will have to insist that the company
- 11 retain counsel for any further proceedings, okay?
- 12 And just so you understand, that's not my
- 13 rule, that's not the PSC's rule; that's the rule of the
- 14 Supreme Court of Missouri. And there's nothing we can
- 15 do but obey it, okay?
- 16 MR. HARRISON: So -- so this meeting really is
- 17 useless because I don't have an attorney because I
- 18 didn't know that I needed one; and I'll have to -- I'm
- 19 going to get with Joyce, which is with the Public
- 20 Service -- I mean, with the Manufactured Housing
- 21 Association and then I'll hire an attorney here in
- 22 Jefferson City to represent us to get with you,
- 23 Mr. Bates.
- And all I would like to do is settle it. Why
- 25 do we have to go to court?

1	MR. BATES: Well, I I think
2	JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
3	MR. BATES: that's something that we can
4	talk about.
5	JUDGE THOMPSON: There being nothing further,
6	this prehearing conference is adjourned.
7	Thank you.
8	MR. BATES: Thank you.
9	JUDGE THOMPSON: This room is available to you
10	until 5 p.m. Be seated, please.
11	WHEREUPON, the on-the-record portion of the
12	prehearing conference was concluded.
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
