JOINT REQUEST FOR WAIVER

Comes now the City of Chillicothe, Missouri ("City") and the Public Water Supply District #2 of Livingston County, Missouri ("District"), and for their Joint Request for Waiver states, in support of same, the following:

- That the parties herein have filed a Joint Application seeking approval of a territorial agreement.
- 2. That attached to the Application was a map which specified the boundaries of each party's responsive territory pursuant to the Agreement.
- 3. That pursuant to 4 CSR 240-3.625 (1)(A), a proposed territorial agreement must have a specific designation of the boundary, including legal description.
- 4. That the parties would jointly request that this requirement be waived and the Commission can grant a waiver if good cause is shown pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.015.
- 5. That the parties have agreed that the boundaries are adequately described in the map which is attached to the Agreement and to obtain specific legal descriptions of each party's territory would be very time consuming and expensive to both parties.
- 6. That the parties would request that the Commission provide expedited treatment with regard to a ruling on this request and that a decision be rendered on same prior to the staff recommendation deadline which is December 20, 2012.

For all of the above mentioned reasons, the parties would jointly request that the

Commission waive the requirement of a legal description under 4 CSR 240-3.625 and that it be determined that the description set forth in the map which is attached to the Agreement is sufficient in defining the parties' respective territories; that the Commission's decision be expedited and delivered prior to the staff's recommendation deadline of December 20, 2012; and for such other and further relief as the Commission may be deemed appropriate under the circumstances.
