1 2 P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S 3 4 We'll go on the record, then. We're here 5 for a prehearing conference in Case No. LC-2005-0080. 6 We're going to begin -- excuse me. The complaint is by 7 MCImetro Access Transmission Services, Brooks Fiber Communication of Missouri Inc., and Intermedia 8 9 Communications, Inc., against CenturyTel of Missouri, 10 Inc. We'll begin by taking entries of appearances. 11 12 First of all, for the MCImetro Company. 13 MR. LUMLEY. Morning Judge. Carl Lumley, 130 South Bemiston, Suite 200, Clayton, Missouri 63105. 14 Appearing on behalf of MCImetro Access Transmission 15 16 Services, LLC, Brooks Fiber Communications of Missouri, 17 Inc., and Intermedia Communications, Inc. JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you, Mr. Lumley. And 18 for CenturyTel of Missouri? 19 20 MR. DORITY: Good morning, Judge. Appearing 21 on behalf of CenturyTel of Missouri, LLC. Larry Dority, 22 Fischer and Dority, P.C. our address is 101 Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri 65101. 23 24 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. And I see Staff 25 is here, as well.

MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing on behalf 1 of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission. 2 3 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Thank you. As a 4 preliminary matter, I just had a question for Mr. Lumley 5 concerning the parties in this case. I know from 6 another case I'm handling, the intermedin will be going 7 away soon. 8 MR. LUMLEY: Right. 9 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Will you be amending your complaint or is that --10 11 MR. LUMLEY: I think that's probably the best thing to do, because it's not really the 12 substitution of the parties since the successor is 13 14 already a party. 15 JUDGE WOODRUFF: The successor will be 16 MCImetro? MR. LUMLEY: Right. So we'll just file an 17 amended complaint indicating that it's not -- at that 18 point will be the sole complainant. 19 20 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Right. 21 Also, I have a question for Staff. Simply, 22 does Staff have a position in this case yet? 23 MR. POSTON: No. We do not. JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. What is -- how does 24 Staff see its role? 25

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1 MR. POSTON: Actually, that was the question 2 I was going to have for you. I mean, we could just 3 monitor the pleadings and way-in with our position, you 4 know, once we get into that stage.

5 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Well, I'll leave it 6 up to you, Staff, to determine what is appropriate. I 7 know the Commission will appreciate the Staff's guidance in these cases as much as possible. I'm going to ask 8 9 that the parties prepare a post procedural schedule, and 10 you can discuss that with the other parties as to what Staff's role in this will be, if you wish to file 11 12 testimony here or whatever is appropriate.

As I indicated, I'll ask you to file a post procedural schedule -- file a joint one. That would be great. If not -- if you can't reach an agreement, you can file separate procedural schedules and the Commission will sort it out.

18 I'll ask you to file that by this Friday,19 the 10th.

20 Is there any other matters that anyone wants 21 to bring up while we're still on the record?

22 MR. DORITY: Your Honor, to the extent that 23 we discussing post procedural schedulings, and if we can 24 come with up with a suggested hearing time, should we 25 communicate with you regarding the Commission's calendar 5

1 in terms of availability?

2 JUDGE WOODRUFF: That's would be fine. Yes. 3 As you're well aware, we have a board upstairs with the 4 calendar. And I was just looking at it this morning, 5 January and February were looking pretty clear, yet. 6 MR. DORITY: Okay. We're probably looking 7 at a March time frame. 8 JUDGE WOODRUFF: That would be fine. I 9 didn't see anything in March either. MR. POSTON: I was going to say, I have 10 copies of the calender up here. 11 12 MR. DORITY: Thank you. 13 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And I will warn you, the 14 electrical calender may not be completely accurate, because the Judges do reserve dates pending a finial 15 16 Commission determination, so the board upstairs is the 17 final say on it. 18 MR. POSTON: Okay. 19 JUDGE WOODRUFF: I know our previous proceeding a few weeks ago, were involving some of the 20 21 same attorneys anyway, we did not have prefiled 22 testimony, and I think I missed having the prefiled 23 testimony for myself, and I kind of got the same feeling 24 from the Commissioners, so since we're not under any 25 sort of tight time frame here, I think that's been

filed, and it indicates that we are not under any tight time frame, we'll probably go ahead and receive prefiled testimony. MR. LUMLEY: That's what our thinking was. JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Anything else that anyone wants to bring up? All right, that concludes the on the record portion of the prehearing conference. We are adjourned. Thank you. MR. LUMLEY: Thank you. Judge. (At this time the prehearing conference was concluded)
