**MOTION TO SUSPEND PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

COME NOW Kansas City Power & Light Company (“KCP&L”) and KCP&L Greater Missouri Operations Company (“GMO”) (collectively, the “Company”) and hereby file their *Motion To Suspend Procedural Schedule*.

1. On December 4, 2018, the Missouri Public Service Commission (“Commission”) issued its *Order Directing Notice of Application and Order Setting Hearing*, which established the procedural schedule in the above-captioned dockets.

2. On December 12, 2018, the Company, Staff for the Commission (“Staff”), and the Office of the Public Counsel (“OPC”) filed their *Joint Motion to Amend Procedural Schedule and Consolidate Cases* (“Motion to Amend”).

3. On December 14, 2018, the Commission issued an order granting the Motion to Amend.

4. The parties to this proceeding have been conducting technical conferences and settlement discussions which have proved to be productive and are considering pursuing an agreement to extend MEEIA Cycle 2 programs for an additional year.

5. The Company recommends the Commission suspend the procedural schedule until February 13, 2019 so that discussions can continue.

6. The Company will file either a revised procedural schedule or a stipulation agreement by February 13, 2019.

7. The Staff, OPC, West Side Housing Organization (“WSHO”), National Housing Trust (“NHT”), Spire, Missouri, Inc. (“Spire”), The Missouri Division of Energy (“DE”), Midwest Energy Consumers Group (“MECG”), Renew Missouri Advocates d/b/a Renew Missouri (“Renew Missouri”), and Natural Resources Defense Council (“NRDC”), and City of St. Joseph, Missouri (“St. Joe”) have been apprised of the contents of this motion. All parties, with the exception of NRDC, have indicated that they either support or do not oppose the motion. NRDC indicated that it objects to the motion.

**WHEREFORE**, the Company respectfully requests the Commission issue an order suspending the procedural schedule.
