ORDER ADOPTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

Issue Date: November 7, 2007 Effective Date: November 7, 2007

On November 7, 2007, the Director of the Manufactured Housing and Modular Units Program of the Missouri Public Service Commission, the Complainant, and Amega Sales, Inc., the Respondent, jointly filed a proposed procedural schedule. Since the parties have agreed to the proposed schedule, the Commission will adopt it. The Commission notes that the parties have decided to forego the prefiling of written testimony. Therefore, all testimony will be offered "live" at the hearing. Also, the proposed schedule includes a settlement conference approximately a week before the hearing. The Commission will treat

that conference as simply a meeting between the parties and will not require the parties to appear before the presiding officer as it would in an "on-the-record" prehearing conference.

The Commission finds that the following conditions shall be applied:

- (A) The parties shall agree upon and Staff shall file a list of the issues to be heard, the witnesses to appear on each day of the hearing, the order in which they will be called, and the order of cross-examination for each witness. Any issue not contained in this list of issues will be viewed as uncontested and not requiring resolution by the Commission.
- (B) Each party shall file a simple and concise statement summarizing its position on each disputed issue.
- (C) All pleadings, briefs, and amendments shall be filed in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.080. Briefs shall follow the same list of issues as filed in the case and must set forth and cite the proper portions of the record concerning the remaining unresolved issues that are to be decided by the Commission.
- (D) All parties are required to bring an adequate number of copies of exhibits that they intend to offer into evidence at the hearing. The party offering an exhibit must bring, in addition to the copy for the court reporter, copies for the five Commissioners, the Presiding Judge, and all counsel.
