On May 17, 2013, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion requesting CLEC, Inc. ("CLEC") certificate of service authority to provide basic local telecommunications services, non-switched local exchange telecommunications services restricted to dedicated private line services, and interexchange telecommunication service in the State of Missouri be cancelled. The Commission granted CLEC a certificate of service authority to provide basic local telecommunications services, non-switched local exchange telecommunications services restricted to dedicated private line services, and interexchange telecommunication service in the State of Missouri in File Number LA-2006-0274.

The Commission need not hold a hearing, if, after proper notice and opportunity to intervene, no party requests such a hearing.¹ Therefore, if no request for a hearing or objection to Staff's motion is received, the Commission may cancel the certificate based on Staff's motion.
