## REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF GRAIN BIN SERVICE BY AQUILA

Re: Electrical service to grain bins located on real estate of Julia J. Bennington at 16237 State Hwy E, Rock Port, Missouri 64482, southwest of Rock Port, Missouri, which is 2 miles West of Exit 107, I-29, on North side of Route E, said real estate located in the Northwest Quarter of Section 17, Township 64, Range 41, in Atchison County, Missouri.

### REASONS FOR REQUEST:

- 1. Insufficient power to grain bins. There are ten government grain bins, approximately 3500 bushels each, with 3/4 hp. fan motors on each for a total of 7½ hp. fan load presently with Aquila.
- 2. There is only one Aquila meter to supply power for both the residence and the grain bins a distance of 800+ feet from primary service (Aquila) to bins.
- 3. There is low voltage in the dwelling when the tenant runs two or more bin fan motors at one time.
- 4. There being only one meter, the homeowner is and has been paying the total utility bill, for the reason the tenant has no way of knowing what the grain bin utility might be.
- 5. Tenant cannot run auger to remove grain from the bins because of lack of power.
- 6. It has been determined by Chad Ottmann of Ottmann Electric, 25137 State Hwy 111, Rock Port, MO 64482 that the underground wiring is defective and not usable.
- 7. Atchison-Holt Electric Cooperative, 18585 Industrial Road, Rock Port, Missouri 64482, has primary service available within 50 feet of bin site, and is willing to provide such service to said bin site.

### REASONS FOR RELEASE OF GRAIN BIN UTILITY SERVICE ONLY:

- 1. It would not be cost effective for Aquila to run 800+ feet of primary underground wire to the grain bin site from the meter.
- 2. There are no plans to build additional bins on the property.
- 3. Aquila service to the dwelling would remain as it now stands.
- 4. A release is being requested only for the grain bin service.
- 5. Power for the grain bin site can be provided by Atchison-Holt Electric Cooperative, Rock Port, Missouri since it has primary service available within 50 feet of the bin site.

The undersigned request that Aquila release the grain bins only from electrical service at said bin site.
