### Title 4 - DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT Division 240—Public Service Commission Chapter 2—Practice and Procedure

#### PROPOSED RULE



4 CSR 240-2.205 Variance or Waiver

Purpose: This rule consolidates variance and waiver into one rule.

The commission may grant variance from or waive any rule or provision of a rule promulgated by the commission upon a finding of good cause.

AUTHORITY: section 386.410 RSMo.

PUBLIC COST: This proposed rule will not cost state agencies or political subdivisions more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate.

PRIVATE COST: This proposed rule will not cost private entities more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND NOTICE TO SUBMIT COMMENTS: Anyone may file a statement in support of or in opposition to the proposed rule with the Missouri Public Service Commission, Morris L.
