ORDER ALLOWING A SHOWING OF GOOD CAUSE

Issue Date: September 28, 2009 Effective Date: September 28, 2009

The Missouri Public Service Commission is allowing a showing of good cause to alter the 30-day notice requirement for a tariff.

A tariff's effective date must be less than 30 days after the tariff's filing date as required by law. ¹ The adoption notice or revised tariff title sheet ("tariff") before the Commission bears an effective of October 5, 2009. The tariff—like the application—was filed on September 8, 2009 at 9:28:48 AM because that is when the Commission's electronic filing and information system ("EFIS") received it.²

But the statutes allow an exception to the 30-day requirement if "the commission otherwise orders[.]" Such an order is subject to the following standard:

The commission for **good cause shown** may allow changes in [tariffs] without requiring the thirty days' notice, under such conditions as it may prescribe. [⁴]

No party has offered good cause for altering the 30-day requirement. The Commission will consider any evidence and argument, offered to show good cause for altering the 30-day requirement, filed as set forth below.
