3	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: The Commission	
4	is calling the action in file number GR-2014-0086,	
5	and that is the general rate action for Summit	
6	Natural Gas of Missouri, Incorporated, which	
7	includes a request for a rate increase.	
8	This is the Missouri Public Service	
9	Commission's Local Public Hearing on the rate	
10	increase.	
11	I am Daniel Jordan. I'm the regulatory	
12	law judge assigned to this action. My job this	
13	evening will be to conduct an orderly proceeding.	
14	And when this entire case concludes, I will draft a	
15	decision which will constitute my recommendation to	
16	the Commission, and then the commissioners will vote	
17	on the final disposition of this action.	
18	Let's begin with entries of appearance.	
19	We'll start with the applicant.	
20	MS. CARTER: Diana Carter with Brydon,	
21	Swearengen & England for Summit Natural Gas of	
22	Missouri.	
23	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you.	
24	And for staff?	
25	MR. BORGMEYER: Thank you, your Honor.	

Page 4 My name is John Borgmeyer, and I'm appearing on 1 2 behalf of the staff of the Public Service 3 Commission, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. 4 5 REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. And for the Office of Public Counsel? 6 7 MS. BAKER: Christina Baker, P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102, appearing on 8 behalf of the Office of Public Counsel and the 9 10 customers. REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you. 11 12 And Commissioner Rupp, do you have any 13 opening remarks for this? 14 COMMISSIONER RUPP: Sure. Thank you, Judge. Just want to thank you for all coming out 15 and welcome you to the public hearing, let you know 16 17 that I am here to listen to everything that you have to say and then report back to the other 18 19 commissioners. 20 Just the fact that I am the only one 21 here does not mean anything about the gravity of the situation, the importance of the issue. We have 22 other cases going on. I left a hearing to get down 23 24 here, so we will all read the transcripts or listen to the -- if it's recorded, the other commissioners 25

1	will be able to hear all of your thoughts as well.	
2	I am here to listen to your comments and	
3	concerns about this case, which means, you know, you	
4	can tell me your thoughts. I could ask you some	
5	questions to help clarify what your statement is;	
6	however, you are not allowed to ask me any	
7	questions, and I am not allowed to respond, because	
8	that could be viewed as pre you know, prejudging	
9	of the case before all the facts are in. So I will	
10	pretty much remain quiet unless I have a comment	
11	that I need clarified by you.	
12	But we are here to listen, and there is	
13	a transcript being made. And I appreciate you	
14	taking the time to come out and talk about this	
15	issue, as we take every issue, every rate increase	
16	extremely, extremely important to the entire state.	
17	So thank you.	
18	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: We are taking	
19	testimony, which is to say that your statements will	
20	be made under oath. So if you wish to speak, come	
21	to the podium, use the microphone so everybody can	
22	hear you. I will administer an oath or an	
23	affirmation, if you prefer.	
24	I'll be calling names from this list.	
25	The nature of the statements that the Commission	

Page 6 finds useful here varies, and different people have 1 2 different views as to what kind of proceeding this 3 is. Though this action constitutes 4 5 litigation, this phase of it, to me, looks a little bit more like investigation; that is, this is a 6 7 really good opportunity for customers and other interested persons to inform the staff and the 8 9 Commission of issues regarding service, issues of billing, issues regarding the safe and adequate 10 service that we hope that a utility will provide to 11 12 its customers. 13 So staff does a very -- works very hard to investigate these things, to investigate service 14 15 issues, but this is their chance to cover more ground than they ever possibly could. It's a very 16 17 big job. 18 So I may ask you a few questions to get you started when you come to the podium. Do speak 19 clearly. Be concise. If you want to make a point 20 21 that was made during the question-and-answer 22 session, make it now so that it will be on the record. If somebody has already said something that 23 24 you agree with, you don't have to repeat what they say. Just tell us that you endorse that position. 25

And you are Sherman Davis? 6 7 MR. DAVIS: Correct. REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Are you a 8 customer of Summit? 9 10 MR. DAVIS: Yes, I am. REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: You're quite 4 5 welcome. 6 Any questions for this witness from 7 Summit? 8 MS. CARTER: No questions. Thank you. REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Anything from 9 10 staff? MR. BORGMEYER: No questions. Thank 11 12 you, your Honor. REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Office of 13 14 Public Counsel? 15 MS. The next name I have is Frank Cardoza. 4 5 Please raise your right hand. CARDOZA: I want to thank everybody 17 being here from Summit Gas. I know I probably came across kind of harsh, but, you know, the facts are 18 the facts, and the figures are the figures. A lot 19 20 of questions were answered, which kinda changed up 21 what I was going to speak, but I do request that the Board consider having a billing analysis, because 22 just what I learned in the short-term or time of 23 24 speaking here, that I've been paying more money than 25 I should have originally, based on my gas

1	consumption. All right? But I want to go with the	
2	figures and wish the Panel, the Board to consider	
3	this.	
4	If I stay under my current plan and I	
5	use about 519 CCFs a year, using the \$1.77, which	
6	rolls in the other charge, the whole thing, okay,	
7	that comes out to \$918.63.	
8	Now, if I go with their SFV plan, which	
9	is a savings, actually and I had to calculate	
10	that out that comes out to \$618. That's a	
11	300-dollar delta. So now I'm questioning why is	
12	there such a delta between the two plans? So I wish	
13	someone to look at that and to look at mitigating	
14	that so it's not such a huge swing.	
15	The customers here, I think a lot of the	
16	questions we have is we get a little, green thing in	
17	the mail, and I had to call around numerous times to	
18	figure out what district we're in because it didn't	
19	say "Lebanon." I caught it down here in the print	
20	here (indicating).	
21	If there was a plan comparison show	
22	us, your customers, where we're at today, what we're	
23	looking at, and what our options would be would	
24	probably help to sell this whole thing.	
25	Because my first fear is that someday,

1	like many, we all retire. We're all on a fixed	
2	income, and 300 bucks or 600 bucks a year is quite a	
3	lot of money for lots of people who are not working	
4	right now. So they don't have that available cash.	
5	Pending your questions.	
6	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Thank you.	
7	First, we'll go with the utility. Any	
8	questions for this witness?	
9	MS. CARTER: No questions. Thank you.	
10	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Staff?	
11	MR. BORGMEYER: No questions. Thank	
12	you.	
13	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: OPC?	
14	MS. BAKER: No. Thank you very much.	
15	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Commissioner?

18	questions, because you referred to some things which	
19	I think you probably explained during the earlier

21	you said you wanted a billing analysis?	
22	MR. CARDOZA: Well, I think as if, you	
23	know, like some people who are salesmen and stuff,	
24	when they get out they look at, hey, your current	
25	bill is this; you're overpaying. If you had this

1	plan, this is a better rate that you should be on.	
2	And to probably answer a lot of	
3	questions people here, when we first signed up, I	
4	didn't know there really was another plan other	
5	than, yeah, you pay an additional ten bucks a month.	
6	If you use X amount of gas, it's not a big deal; you	
7	don't get charged that.	
8	Now, maybe I should have read the small	
9	print, and I'm guilty of that. So I have a hot	
10	water heater. I always burn gas throughout the	
11	year. So that I never thought twice about it.	
12	I never knew that the proposed piece	
13	I actually thought your proposed your 73 cents is	
14	what I was really going to get charged. So I didn't	
15	panic too much about it because I'm already paying	
16	70 cents, so it's only a 4-cent difference.	
17	I come to find out tonight that that's	
18	not reality. So it really wasn't explained very	
19	well on this sheet. So my fear is when the \$1.77	
20	one came out and I did the quick calculator piece,	
21	that's a pretty significant jump.	
22	REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. Go	
23	ahead.	
24	MR. CARDOZA: But I understand the	
25	difference in the plans now, figuring it out, but if	

Page 14 I had known that and if I was a retired person, I 1 2 could have saved a few bucks. 3 REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: And the document that you're referring to there that you 4 5 just were telling me about --6 MR. CARDOZA: Is the one that came out 7 in the last bill, I think. This is the one that came out in the mail, that Summit sent out with 8 their gas bills. 9 10 REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. So that's an enclosure? 11 12 MR. CARDOZA: Correct. REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: That's not the 13 notice of local public hearing, is it? 14 15 MR. CARDOZA: This little piece right here (indicating), public hearing scheduled, down at 16 17 the bottom. 18 REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. 19 MR. CARDOZA: It came in the mail. You 20 get your bill. Here (indicating). 21 REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. MR. CARDOZA: And this was in the 22 envelope. Most people probably discarded it, 23 24 thinking it was junk mail or some advertising thing. 25 REGULATORY JUDGE JORDAN: Would you mind
