2	JUDGE CLARK: Good afternoon. Today's date is
3	March 18 of 2019. It is currently 2:04 p.m. We're in
4	Room 305 of the Governor Office Building. The
5	Commission has set aside this time today for a Discovery
6	Conference in the case captioned as In the Matter of
7	Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri's Tariffs
8	to Increase Its Revenues for Natural Gas Service, File
9	No. GR-2019-0077.
10	My name is John Clark. I'm the Regulatory Law
11	Judge in this matter. I'm going to begin by asking the
12	attorneys to enter their appearance starting with Ameren
13	Missouri?
14	MS. GRUBBS: Jermaine Grubbs on behalf of
15	Ameren Missouri, and my information has been provided to
16	the court reporter.
17	MR. MITTEN: Russ Mitten on behalf of Ameren
18	Missouri. I've also provided my information to the
19	court reporter.
20	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you. Commission staff?
21	MR. BERLIN: Judge, thank you. Appearing on
22	behalf of the staff of the Missouri Public Service
23	Commission are Robert S. Berlin and Ron Irving. I
24	believe the court reporter has all our contact
25	information.

1	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you. On behalf of the
2	Office of the Public Counsel?
3	MR. HALL: Caleb Hall on behalf of public
4	counsel. Our office has provided our contact
5	information to the court reporter.
6	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you. Anybody on the line
7	on behalf of the Missouri Division of Energy? I hear no
8	one. On behalf of the Missouri Industrial Energy
9	Consumers Group, MIEC? I hear no one.
10	The Missouri School Boards' Association
11	e-mailed indicating they would not be participating in
12	today's discovery conference. I assume everybody
13	received that e-mail. National Housing Trust?
14	MR. LINHARES: Good afternoon, Judge. On
15	behalf of National Housing Trust, this is Andrew
16	Linhares. Address is 3115 S. Grand, Suite 600, St.
17	Louis, Missouri 63118.
18	JUDGE CLARK: Mr. Linhares, would you spell
19	your name for the court reporter?
20	MR. LINHARES: Absolutely. L-i-n-h-a-r-e-s.
21	JUDGE CLARK: Anyone present on behalf of
22	Renew Missouri?
23	Anyone present on behalf of Spire?
24	Have I missed anyone? Okay. Are there any
25	Before we get into the meat of the matter for today, are

there any preliminary matters or pending motions that do not relate to today's discovery conference?

Okay. Now, the last time we were here the parties agreed to see what discovery issues could be informally resolved without a commission order and to meet back here today to address unresolved or contested discovery issues. Why don't we jump into that. As I said last time, if there's going to be any confidential information presented, let me know before that information is presented because we have a court reporter present and whatever is going to be posted to EFIS I want to be sure that it's posted to EFIS appropriately with the correct confidential designation if necessary.

In regard to that, I left with a list last time, and I think everybody agreed on a list, and I don't remember the exact number, of some that were outstanding, some that were resolved, some that were going to be resolved by the end of the day, some that were going to be resolved on Friday, some that were just unknown and possibly some that were contested. Why don't we, if nobody has any objections to this, why don't we go through the list and knock out the ones that have been taken care of so that I can see what's left and then I'll let the parties go. Does that work for

everybody? 1 2 MR. BERLIN: Judge, if you allow me to go through the list, I think I can do it a little bit 3 4 quicker, because the company has responded to quite a I only have some questions on a few remaining 5 6 ones that are in process. 7 JUDGE CLARK: Any objections to doing that? 8 MR. MITTEN: No.

16	to DRs 5 and 6, staff out of an abundance of caution, I
17	believe, we also submitted supplemental DRs to clarify
18	what may be any vagueness in the original DRs 5 and 6.
19	That's the whole purpose of that is just to clarify any
20	vagueness. I don't anticipate any issues to arise.
21	MR. MITTEN: We think the information that
22	you're going to be looking at tomorrow and Wednesday is
23	going to clear up both the original and the supplemental
24	DR.
25	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. That was in regard to,

1	Mr. Mitten, your comment last time regarding the scope
2	of the request?
3	MR. MITTEN: Yes. We've greatly expanded the
4	scope.
5	MR. BERLIN: There's one more DR I would just
6	like to mention, DR 95. That is one where we asked for
7	other revenue contracts along with five years of other
8	revenue and did not receive contracts. We still need
9	affiliate revenue documentation available other than
10	leases, and that's my comment on that unless Mr. Cassidy
11	or Ms. Ferguson wish to make a comment about DR 95.
12	MS. FERGUSON: This is Lisa Ferguson. I did
13	reach out to Laura Moore this morning. They had
14	supplemented the DR with one of the contracts, but we
15	still need some affiliate revenue documentation. There
16	is They're not going to have leases to supplement
17	with because that's part of an ongoing issue in their
18	Cam case right now, but they should have some kind of
19	invoice documentation that shows rental revenue and
20	utilities.
21	MR. MITTEN: Lisa, did you and Laura come to
22	some sort of an agreement as to what she was going to be
23	able to provide you?
24	MS. FERGUSON: On 95?
25	MR. MITTEN: Yes.

MS. FERGUSON: Yes. We had talked about it. 1 2 Because of the fact that there's a Cam case going on right now, leases haven't been executed with the 3 4 utilities yet. So she did say that there was some type of invoice documentation that she could provide me that 5 6 would show the rental revenue and the utilities that the 7 affiliates are paying Ameren Missouri. So I just sent 8 her an e-mail this morning to see if she couldn't 9 supplement that in the DR as well. 10 MR. MITTEN: Okay. Thank you. 11 MR. BERLIN: Other than that, Judge, I have no 12 other comments to make. Appreciate the cooperation of 13 the company in getting these answered. 14 JUDGE CLARK: Okay. Now the last time we left 15 off it was noted that there was several that the staff 16 felt was answered unsatisfactorily. Are those at this 17 point resolved to at least where staff would be 18 satisfied with the answers they received? 19 MR. BERLIN: Judge, I'm going to have to punt 20 that one over to Ms. Ferguson and Mr. Cassidy or Mr. 21 Murray if they have any comments. I believe we're okay, 22 but I want to be clear. 23 MR. MITTEN: Or at least we're moving toward 24 okay because some of the information they thought was unsatisfactory is the information they're going to be 25

1	looking at tomorrow and Wednesday.					
2	MS. FERGUSON: I will agree with Mr. Mitten on					
3	that. That was the majority of it. However, we did					
4	discuss when Bob was reading off the list of numbers,					
5	that included the inadequate responses. So 95 is the					
6	only one left that has an inadequate response of which					
7	we just talked about.					
8	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. And our next discovery					
9	conference is scheduled for April 2, I believe.					
10	MS. FERGUSON: Yes. And I assume that after					
11	we get done looking at the board documentation and the					
12	other items that are promised for us on Wednesday, if we					
13	find that we're still missing something we can always					
14	address that.					
15	MR. MITTEN: We want to reiterate that if					
16	staff believes any of the responses that we've given					
17	them are inadequate if they'll let us know immediately					
18	we'll try and get with that issue.					
19	MS. FERGUSON: And I've been trying to do so,					
20	Mr. Mitten.					
21	MR. MITTEN: No, I wasn't suggesting					
22	otherwise, Lisa.					
23	MS. FERGUSON: I wanted you to know that I'm					
24	still trying.					
25	JUDGE CLARK: Anything further, Mr. Berlin?

18	MR. BERLIN: None, Judge. Thank you.
