## ORDER DIRECTING NOTICE, SETTING INTERVENTION DEADLINE, AND ADDING A PARTY

Issue Date: August 24, 2023

Effective Date: August 24, 2023

This order provides notice of this application to interested parties, establishes a deadline for intervention and for requesting a hearing, and joins the other party to the Interconnection Agreement, Barr Tell USA, LLC, as a party to this proceeding.

On August 16, 2023, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, d/b/a AT&T Missouri, filed an application with the Commission for approval of an Amendment (Amendment) to a negotiated Interconnection Agreement (Agreement) with Barr Tell USA, LLC under the provisions of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the Act). AT&T Missouri states that there are no unresolved issues and that the Amendment complies with Section 252(e) of the Act in that it is consistent with the public interest, convenient and necessary, and is not discriminatory to nonparty carriers.

Although Barr Tell USA, LLC is a party to the Amendment, it did not join in the application. Because Barr Tell USA, LLC is a necessary party to a full and fair adjudication of this matter, the Commission will add Barr Tell USA, LLC as a party to this case.

The Act provides that an Agreement must be approved unless the state commission finds that the Agreement discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the Agreement, or that implementation of the Agreement is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.<sup>1</sup> Section 252(e)(4) of the Act provides that if the Commission has not acted to approve or reject an Agreement within 90 days after submission, the Agreement shall be deemed approved. That date is November 14, 2023.

The Commission finds that proper persons shall be allowed 15 days from the issuance of this order to file a motion for hearing. The Commission also finds that notice of this application shall be sent to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies. The Staff of the Commission (Staff) will be directed to provide recommendation.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Commission's Data Center shall send a copy of this order to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies.
2. Barr Tell USA, LLC is made a party to this case.
3. Any party wishing to intervene or request a hearing shall do so by filing a pleading no later than September 8, 2023.
4. Staff shall file a recommendation advising either approval or rejection of this Amendment and giving the reasons therefor, or a request for an extension of time, no later than September 23, 2023.
