Dear Mr. Cooper:

I received a notice from the Public Service Commission regarding an application made on behalf of Missouri Gas Utility for approval to construct gas utilities and provide gas service to certain areas in the Lake of the Ozarks area. After speaking with Judge Daniel Jordan, I downloaded a site map that shows potential areas where construction may take place. Because I own or co-own several parcels that could be impacted, I sought more detailed information regarding the matter.

To that end, I spoke with some other property owners included in the notification I received. At least one person on the list has no idea why they were included, as they own no property that would be affected. And my sister-in-law, who co-owns many of the parcels with me, was not notified. That raises a concern of due diligence for me.

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I spoke this morning with Tim Johnston, Executive Vice President and Engineer with the Missouri Gas Company. I requested a more detailed explanation of what the company intends. Mr. Johnston told me that the company is seeking to lay down a natural gas line from the Lincoln/Warsaw area into the Sunrise Beach/Laurie area and coming on down to Lake Ozark and Osage Beach. He said it is the company's intent to use a public right of way along Highway 54 to lay the lines. If an easement is needed over personal property, such an easement would be sought from the owners on a case by case basis.

I am sending this letter to you as a documentation of the actions I've taken and the information I've received to date. I would appreciate being kept advised, in a timely manner, of all future intentions by the Missouri Gas Company regarding this project.
