
**KANSAS CITY POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S RESPONSE TO ORDER SETTING
PREHEARING CONFERENCE AND DIRECTING FILING
OF PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

Comes now the Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCPL") in response to the September 27, 2004 Order Setting Prehearing Conference of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") wherein the Commission directed that the parties file a proposed procedural schedule no later than October 21, 2004. In response to the Commission's Order Setting Prehearing Conference, regarding the filing of a proposed procedural schedule, KCPL states as follows:

1. A Prehearing Conference occurred on October 14, 2004. KCPL, the Staff and the Office of the Public Counsel ("Public Counsel") (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Parties") appeared and participated.
2. After discussion and negotiation, the Parties have reached an agreement in principle.
3. The Parties are working toward filing a Stipulation And Agreement with the Commission in the next week.

Wherefore KCPL requests that the Commission accept this filing as the KCPL's response to the Commission's directive that the Parties file a proposed procedural schedule by October 21, 2004.


