Public NA Response to Interim Data Request No. 120 Missouri Case ER-2012-0345 Austerity Plans

The Company does not have a formal, written austerity or economy plan designed to reduce expenses and/or cash outflows below the results produced by normal operations. However, during the last five years, which included a very heavy construction cycle, executive management has continually evaluated the business conditions and the economic climate to see if restrictions in spending are appropriate. This evaluation process is still in place today and was in place when the tornado struck Joplin in May of 2011. Executive management will instruct Company personal to reduce spending below budgeted levels when appropriate. These instructions are generally communicated to department heads who report directly to executive management. Department heads are charged with communicating such instructions to personnel in their respective area. As a result of the tornado, Empire incentive pay plans for executive officers and department heads were either eliminated or substantially reduced and Empire's dividend was suspended for two quarters.

Prior to the May 2011 tornado there have been several instances in which executive management instructed Company personnel to take actions to reduce operating and capital expenditures below budgeted levels. In addition, during the last five years, many times the Company instituted a hiring freeze for a number of months.. In 2009, executive management and department heads were given the option to receive incentive bonus awards in the form of Company common stock to control cash outflows.

The Company also engages in initiatives designed to reduce spending and increase efficiencies in the long term. Some examples of these initiatives include a supply chain alliance and commercial operations staffing plan, a Board of Directors information portal, and various initiatives designed to increase productivity through improved response to outages, management of vegetation maintenance, and improved overall system reliability.
