## CASE NO. SA-80-208

In the matter of the application of Water's Edge Sewer Company for permission and approval and for a certificate of convenience and necessity authorizing it to construct, install, own, operate, control, manage and maintain a sewer system for the public located in an unincorporated area in Boone County, Missouri.

## ORDER GRANTING PETITION

on February 21, 1980, the Water's Edge Sewer Company filed its application for a certificate of convenience and necessity. A hearing about such application was held on May 30, 1980, at which permission to file briefs was requested and granted. On October 23, 1980, the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission filed a motion for extension of time to file Staff's brief, which was due on October 22, 1980. This motion was granted on October 27, 1980, due to belief that an agreement of the parties as to all disputed matters was imminent and, therefore, a reopening of the record would be necessary to consider such an agreement.

On October 29, 1980, the Staff filed its petition to set aside the submission and reopen the proceedings for the taking of additional evidence. The petition states that Protestant Boone Water & Waste, Inc. (BW&W), is negotiating to transfer BW&W's assets and certificate to one Vernon Stump. The petition further states that Mr. Stump is negotiating with the Applicant to resolve any conflicts in authority.

In addition to the above material changes of fact, Staff and other parties intend to introduce additional evidence which was not previously adduced due to events occurring after the hearing.

On the basis of the above information the Commission is of the opinion that the petition should be granted.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That Staff's petition to set aside the submission and reopen the proceedings for the taking of additional evidence is granted.

ORDERED: 2. That the proceedings be reopened on the 5th day of February, 1981, at 10:00 AM, in the Commission's hearing room on the tenth floor of the

Jefferson State Office Building, Jefferson City, Missouri, for the purpose of receiving additional evidence. ORDERED: 3. That this order shall become effective on the date hereof.
