ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF

On October 19, 2006,¹ Southwestern Bell Telephone, L.P. d/b/a AT&T Missouri ("AT&T") filed its proposal to revise its General Exchange Tariff by adding Section 59 containing its intent to offer 811 Service pursuant to the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") March 14, 2005 Sixth Report and Order in the Matter of the Use of N11 Codes and Other Abbreviated Dialing Arrangements, 20 FCC Rcd 5539 (2005). The provision of 811 Service utilizes the abbreviated dialing code reserved by the FCC to assist excavators in notifying underground facility operators of upcoming excavation activities. The tariff, as originally filed by AT&T, had an effective date of November 18.

On November 13, Missouri One Call System, Inc. ("MOCS") filed a timely request to intervene and a motion to suspend the tariff. On November 16, the Commission granted

MOCS intervention, issued notice, suspended AT&T's tariff until January 17, 2007, and set an expedited hearing schedule. An evidentiary hearing was held on December 21, 2006.

During the evidentiary hearing, the parties acknowledged that to have adequate time for a post-hearing briefing schedule, and adequate time for the Commission to decide the matter and issue an order, that an additional tariff suspension of thirty days would be required. All parties voiced their support for the additional suspension.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The proposed tariff sheets submitted on October 19, 2006, by Southwestern Bell Telephone, L.P. d/b/a AT&T Missouri, and assigned Tariff No. JI-2007-0260, originally suspended for a period of 60 days beyond their proposed effective date of November 18, 2006 to January 17, 2007, will now be suspended for an additional 30 days or until February 16, 2007.
