**RESPONSE BY MIDWEST ENERGY USERS' ASSOCIATION
IN SUPPORT OF MIEC MOTION FOR
EXTENSION OF TIME AND FOR EXPEDITED TREATMENT**

COME NOW the Midwest Energy Users' Association (MEUA),
and for their response to MIEC's Motion for Extension of Time and
Expedited Treatment respectfully state:

1. On December 22, 2011, KCP&L Greater Missouri
Operations Company (GMO) filed under the Missouri Energy Effi-
ciency Investment Act (MEEIA) for Commission approval of certain
energy efficiency programs. The GMO application also sought
program cost recovery, lost revenue recovery and certain incen-
tive payments to the utility.

2. On March 7, 2012 MIEC submitted its Motion to
Extend Rebuttal Testimony Filing Date and Motion for Expedited
Treatment. MIEC cites GMO's delay in responding to MIEC data
requests and its expert's travel schedule pursuant to a
previously scheduled hearing some distance away.

3. For the reasons stated by MIEC, MEUA supports
granting this Motion to extend the time for rebuttal for all.

The expedited schedule called for by Commission Rules mandates that the utility, the source of most, if not all, of the data, respond expeditiously to data requests.

WHEREFORE MEUA respectfully requests that MIEC's Motion be expeditiously granted.


