- JUDGE HOPKINS: This is April the 26th, year
- 3 2001. It's after 10 a.m. in the morning. We're in
- 4 Jefferson City, Room 305 of the Governor Office Building,
- 5 Case No. MC-2000-660, Director of the Division of
- 6 Manufactured Homes, Recreational Vehicles and Modular Units
- 7 of the Public Service Commission, Complainant vs. Discount
- 8 Manufactured Housing, Inc., Respondent.
- 9 They are represented by an attorney, Daniel
- 10 Carter of Warrensburg. And Mr. Bates, are you -- are your
- 11 clients here?
- MR. BATES: Yes, your Honor.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: And make your entry of
- 14 appearance, please.
- 15 MR. BATES: Good morning, your Honor. My name
- 16 is Bruce H. Bates. I'm an attorney representing the Staff
- 17 of the Missouri Public Service Commission. My address is
- 18 P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102-0360.
- 19 JUDGE HOPKINS: Okay. Mr. Carter is not here
- 20 even though he was sent an Order appearing to be here. So I
- 21 am going to reschedule this prehearing conference. We've
- 22 already got one set on May 2nd. I'm going to be gone to a
- 23 seminar the next week. Would sometime after May 14, in that
- 24 region somewhere?
- 25 MR. BATES: Your Honor, that would be fine. I

- 1 believe I have a hearing May 9th through 11th and then
- 2 picking up again the 14th and 15th, but sometime after that
- 3 would be fine.
- 4 JUDGE HOPKINS: We can do it on 17 May 2001.
- 5 MR. BATES: That would be fine. Thank you,
- 6 your Honor.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: I'll get an Order out to that
- 8 effect today, and I appreciate your being here.
- 9 We're off the record.
- 10 (Discussion off the record.)
- 11 JUDGE HOPKINS: We're back on the record
- 12 again. It is a few minutes after we had recessed the first
- 13 part of this hearing, and we find that Mr. Carter has shown
- 14 up. You're Daniel Carter?
- MR. CARTER: Yes, sir.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: And why are you late,
- 17 Mr. Carter?
- 18 MR. CARTER: Your Honor, we were in some
- 19 traffic. There was road construction. We were detained.
- 20 We arrived here at the building approximately ten o'clock.
- 21 We left Warrensburg, Missouri at eight o'clock this morning,
- 22 sir. There was road construction between here and there.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: Would you make your entry of
- 24 appearance here, please.
- 25 MR. CARTER: My name is Dan Carter. I'm a

- 1 licensed attorney, Bar No. 31223, appearing for Discount
- 2 Manufactured Housing, the Respondent in this matter.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: I don't believe there's any
- 4 unruled motions here. The main reason for this prehearing
- 5 conference is to determine whether there are any actual
- 6 issues in controversy and whether the controversy can be
- 7 resolved or settled.
- 8 The prehearing order, which was issued on the
- 9 9th of February 2001, stated that an early prehearing
- 10 conference should be scheduled to afford the parties to --
- 11 I'm sorry -- afford the parties the opportunity to discuss,
- 12 define and possibly resolve the issues presented in this
- 13 case or at least to agree on a procedural schedule.
- 14 Mr. Bates, briefly could you tell me what the
- 15 Director sees as the main issue here?
- MR. BATES: Your Honor, to the Director's
- 17 knowledge, there are a number of issues remaining as far as
- 18 corrections and alterations to the home in question and some
- 19 work that still remains to be done by the Respondent on that
- 20 home.
- 21 JUDGE HOPKINS: Okay. And Mr. Carter, do you
- 22 want to give us your idea of what you think the main issues
- 23 are here, sir?
- MR. CARTER: The issue, the only unresolved
- 25 work that we know of and set forth in the petition was a

- 1 matter of a portion of a subframe was removed after the home
- 2 had been placed in the permanent at the request of the
- 3 owner. A section was removed to accommodate a garage door.
- 4 To our knowledge, that's the only issue remaining. I don't
- 5 believe there's any other unresolved work on the part of
- 6 this respondent anyway.
- JUDGE HOPKINS: All right, sir. Thank you.
- 8 We will expect a procedural schedule on 10 May 2001, and
- 9 this is optional at this time, not mandatory, but we're
- 10 going to strongly encourage you to submit Suggested Findings
- 11 of Fact and Conclusions of Law with me along with your
- 12 Statement of Position, and the Findings of Fact, Conclusions
- 13 of Law should be submitted in hard copy and electronic copy
- 14 also.
- 15 MR. CARTER: Pardon me, sir. How many copies?
- 16 JUDGE HOPKINS: Hard copy and electronic copy.
- 17 MR. CARTER: Thank you.
- 18 JUDGE HOPKINS: And I actually don't expect it
- 19 to go this far. This case is over a year old, and I would
- 20 suspect you-all will be able to settle it, but if you do
- 21 not, I need that procedural schedule by the 5th of May.
- 22 All right. Thank you-all very much. I'll be
- 23 around today if you need me. Thank you, Mr. Bates and
- 24 Mr. Carter. We do start on time here in Jeff City.
