AMENDED MOTION FOR FINDING OF NECESSITY OF RULEMAKING

COMES NOW the Director of the Manufactured Housing and Modular Units Program of the Missouri Public Service Commission (“Director” and “Program”), by and through the Missouri Public Service Commission’s (“Commission”) Office of General Counsel, and for his *Amended Motion for Finding of Necessity of Rulemaking* (“Motion”) states as follows:

1. The Director states that the proposed rulemaking will have no fiscal impact on any private or public person or entity affected by this rulemaking. On November 14, 2000, the Commission had ordered the Director to file a pleading setting out the fiscal impact of the proposed rulemaking, and identifying the statute cited as authority in his previous motion.
2. The Director proposes to amend Rule 4 CSR 240-120.011 to reflect the removal of any reference to recreational vehicles.
3. This rulemaking is necessary to provide uniformity among the rules pertaining to manufactured housing and updates this rule with current industry terminology, and because jurisdiction of the regulation of recreational vehicles was removed from the Commission by Section 700.015, RSMo (Cum.Supp. 1999).

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WHEREFORE, the Director respectfully requests that the Commission, based upon reasonably available empirical data including an assessment of the effectiveness and costs both to the State and to any private or public person or entity affected, find that the proposed amendment to 4 CSR 240-120.011 is necessary to update and make uniform the rules pertaining to manufactured housing and for such other reasons as stated herein.


