**SUPPLEMENTAL RESPONSE TO COMMISSION ORDER**

**COMES NOW** The Empire District Electric Company, a Liberty Utilities company (“Liberty-Empire”), and respectfully submits this supplemental response to the questions presented by the Commission in its *Order Opening an Investigation of Missouri Jurisdictional Generator Self-Commitments and Self-Scheduling*, issued June 5, 2019, and its *Order Directing Comments*, issued June 24, 2019.

1. Liberty-Empire filed its initial Response to Commission Order herein on July 8, 2019. Attached as Exhibit A to that filing were Liberty-Empire’s responses to the six initial questions set forth in the Commission’s June 5<sup>th</sup> *Order Opening an Investigation of Missouri Jurisdictional Generator Self-Commitments and Self-Scheduling*, for each of its generation facilities and on an annual basis over the last three years.
2. After further review and analysis, it was discovered that the summary information initially presented in Exhibit A contained duplicate data. The dataset contained multiple offers for resources within the same hour. This occurs when offers are re-offered or adjusted in the Day-Ahead market. The result of the duplication skews the summary results. The duplicate data has been removed, and a corrected Exhibit A is attached hereto.

**Wherefore,** The Empire District Electric Company, a Liberty Utilities company, submits its Supplemental Response to Commission Order.
