Staff Recommendation to Approve the Transfer of Assets from Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, to SBCS Switches, Inc.

I. Application

On September 07, 1999 Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT), an incumbent local telecommunications carrier, filed with the Public Service Commission (Commission) an Application for Authority to Transfer Certain Assets (Application) to SBCS Switches, Inc. (SBCSS), a whollyowned subsidiary of SWBT. SWBT and SBCSS, hereinafter collectively referred to as Parties (Parties), propose this transaction following which SBCSS will merge with and into SBC Services, Inc. (SBCS), with SBCS to become the surviving entity, and SBCSS to cease to exist. Approval of that merger is not a part of this Application. SBCS will become the ultimate user of the subject assets. Also on September 07, 1999, SWBT filed a Motion to Expedite Review and Approval of the Application, requesting that the Commission issue an Order approving the Application by December 01, 1999.

On September 21, 1999, the Commission issued an Order Establishing Time for Filing of **Recommendation** directing the Staff of the Commission to file its recommendations concerning the Application by November 10, 1999.

II. Background

SWBT provides intrastate local and intraLATA interexchange telecommunications services and currently operates in Missouri under a series of tariffs. SWBT does not seek to transfer any assets used to provide telecommunications services in Missouri. Following this transaction, SWBT will continue to provide services to Missouri customers according to the existing certification and to the rates, terms and conditions described in the tariffs, with no interruption of service.

Neither before nor following this transaction will either SBCSS or SBCS be subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission. The subject assets of interest are to be used to provide a variety of administrative and

support services to SWBT and other entities on a centralized basis. The transfer of assets is expected to result in cost savings for all Parties due to efficiencies in financial resources, facilities and expertise.

In compliance with 4 CSR 240-2.060(5)(G), the Parties have declared that the proposed transaction will have no impact, or will have only positive impact, on the tax revenues of the State of Missouri or of any political subdivision therein.

III. Staff Recommendation

The Telecommunications Department Staff (Staff) has reviewed the application and believes that it meets the limited requirements of 4 CSR 240-2.060 (1) and (5). Staff has no objections to the proposed transfer and recommends that the Commission issue an order that approves the proposed transfer of assets from SWBT to SBCSS.

Staff is unaware of any other filings that would affect, or be affected by, this proposal.
