

**NOTICE OF AN APPLICATION FOR A REHEARING**

Comes now, Mr. Craig Mershon informing the Commissioners he intends to file an Application for a Rehearing within 10 to 15 working days depending on how fast he can type the document. Mr. Mershon suffers from Nystagmus and Spastic paralysis which gives him limitations in vision as well as in physical movements so it takes a little bit longer for him to do his typing and other household chores as well as bill paying and trying to get things accomplished but they eventually are accomplished. He knows he was treated very unfairly by the Commissioners, Ameren Missouri and their attorney and the Missouri Public Service Commission attorney and staff. He does not feel this way it actually happened so he hopes that the Commissioners are fair to him because they have not been since this case has been going on. He is requesting fair treatment by all involved. He is requesting that everything stay in place such as the unfair threatening disconnection notices and unfair payment schedules until the complaint is settled.

These are some of the things that are under dispute in the original complaint. Mr. Mershon realizes that he has the right to have a rehearing even though he did not have a hearing at all because the Commissioners and the staff and attorneys refused to allow him to do discovery which is under their state regulations. This rehearing would be under CSR 240-2.160. At this time Mr. Mershon has no rules since the Commissioners and attorneys have not allowed him to have such information. The little information he has received came from Mr. Morris Woodruff, Secretary for the Commissioners from the Missouri Public Service Commission. If more time is needed to complete the Application for a Rehearing Mr. Mershon will ask for it. He is entitled to accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act 1990.
