Motion for Oral Argument

Holnam Inc., Lone Star Industries, Inc., and River Cement Company ("MEG Interruptibles") have previously filed their Application for Approval of an Interim Alternative Interruptible Rate on or about March 20, 2000 and further have concurrently filed suggestions in support of their request for approval and implementation of such rate. MEG hereby requests oral argument on the issues raised in such pleadings.

In support of this Motion, the MEG Interruptibles state as follows:

- 1. The issues raised in these pleadings including, without limitation, the issue of system reliability, have far-reaching consequences, and we submit, it would be beneficial and helpful to the Commission to permit oral argument by the parties thereon.
- 2. The benefits to the MEG Interruptibles under a prior interruptible tariff which had been in effect for many years at UE, were approximately \$2.4 million per year. Effective June 1 of this year, such benefits were terminated and accordingly the MEG interruptibles have been substantially and adversely impacted by such action. Granting of the Application for an Interim Alternative Interruptible rate and preservation of the status quo will avoid the adverse impact on these customers.
- 3. Because we are rapidly approaching the summer peak load season, time is of the essence and an early date for argument would be appropriate.

4. There are many other issues which are significant and we submit it would be helpful to discuss in oral argument before this Commission.

WHEREFORE, the MEG Interruptibles move this Commission to grant oral argument on their Application for Approval and Implementation of an Interim Alternative Interruptible Rate.
