

MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Comes now AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc.
("AT&T Communications") in the above-entitled case and
respectfully states to the Commission:

1. By its Order Establishing Docket issued November
3, 1986, in the above-styled case, the Commission ordered,
inter alia, that utilities file with the Commission the revenue
impact of the federal tax changes resulting from the 1986 Tax
Reform Act to 1985 Missouri jurisdictional operations (or more
current historical test year). The Commission further ordered
that any company or other interested person may file
recommendations addressing procedural alternatives for
recognizing the effects of the changes in the 1986 Tax Reform
Act. Said Order directed that both filings be made on or
before December 15, 1986.

2. AT&T Communications has been working diligently to
compile the requested information; however, AT&T Communications
will not be able to make the requested filings by December 15,
1986. As the Commission is well aware, the interexchange
carrier industry has been involved in the critical discovery
process involving the tariff filings of individual-local
exchange carrier state access charges, and AT&T Communications
has had to focus attention and resources to these matters.
AT&T Communications will be able to file the requested
information with the Commission on or before December 22, 1986.

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PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

3. For the reasons stated above, AT&T Communications respectfully requests that the Commission grant an extension of time of one week beyond the December 15, 1986 deadline, until December 22, 1986, for the filing of the requested information by AT&T Communications. The undersigned Attorney has advised the Assistant General Counsel for the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff") and the Office of the Public Counsel of this request, and neither party objects to this request for extension of time. AT&T Communications does not request this extension in order to unnecessarily hinder or delay this proceeding.

WHEREFORE, AT&T Communications requests that the deadline for filing the requested information and comments be extended to December 22, 1986, for AT&T Communications, and that the Commission forthwith issue an order granting the extension as requested.
