Dear Mr. Hubbs:

KCPL made its December 15, 1986 filing herein under seal because it contained certain financial projections. including estimates of future earnings, in Schedules 6 and 7. These projections were not required by the Commission's November 3, 1986 were submitted with the expectation of their Order, but confidential treatment. Their content is not necessary to explain the effects of the Tax Reform Act on KCPL's Missouri operations.

On or about January 23, 1987, Public Counsel filed a motion to unseal and make public all or part of KCPL's December 15, 1986 filing. KCPL has discussed this matter with Public Counsel, and believes that it has reached an accommodation which will result in Public Counsel's withdrawing its motion as it applies to KCPL. KCPL understands that Public Counsel will confirm this in a filing with the Commission upon receipt and review of this letter.

KCPL hereby withdraws its assertion of confidentiality over, and requests that the Commission unseal, all parts of its December 15, 1986 report except Schedules 6 and 7 thereof. These two schedules contain confidential financial projections which must remain under seal; their disclosure may provide potentially misleading financial information (since the information is in the schedules do not set forth all assumptions summary form, underlying the projections), and subject KCPL to possible liability and SEC reporting requirements.
