Objection. This interrogatory is overly broad, unduly burdensome in scope and expense, is not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible information, is not relevant to the subject matter of the Director's complaint, requires the Director to create documents, charts and

lists that are not maintained by the Director, and seeks information within the possession and control of Respondent Brookside Homes, Inc.

The Director sought similar information from the Respondent in Case No. MC-2009-0127 to which Respondent Brookside and its owner, Steven Warren, asserted a Fifth Amendment privilege not to respond.
