ORDER RECOGNIZING NOTICE TO REMOVE POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS

On November 7, 2012, Allegiance Communications, LLC filed a Notice of Change Application with the Commission to notify them of the discontinuance of service in a number of political subdivisions the company serves. On December 5, 2012, Allegiance filed a request to postpone the termination of the political subdivisions listed in the November 7, 2012 Notice. The Company indicated they wished to pursue a potential buyer for the properties. The Commission granted their request to postpone the termination.

Allegiance filed a status report on March 26, 2013, indicating they wished to renew their request to postpone termination on Gower, Maysville, and Plattsburg, Missouri, continue to serve Rushville, Missouri, and terminate Dearborn, Camden Point, Braymer, Seligman, and Washburn, Missouri. The Commission granted their request to postpone termination for Maysville, Gower and Plattsburg, Missouri and ordered Allegiance to file a status report regarding those political subdivisions no later than September 26, 2013. In that same order, the Commission ordered Staff to file a recommendation regarding the

termination of the remaining political subdivisions listed in Allegiance's November 7, 2012 request to terminate.

On April 8, 2013, the Commission, acting on Staff's recommendation, amended Allegiance's authorization and removed the video service authorization for the political subdivisions of Dearborn, Camden Point, Braymer, Seligman, and Washburn from Allegiance's video franchise service area, areas in which Allegiance has notified the Commission it will no longer serve.

On May 10, 2013, the Commission issued an Order Directing Notice, providing the company until September 26, 2013, to file a status report. Allegiance filed a status report on May 29, 2013, indicating they wished to terminate video service authorizations for all political subdivisions in the State of Missouri that are served by Allegiance.

The Commission has reviewed the filings made by Allegiance and finds that in accordance with Section 67.2685, RSMo (Supp. 2012), the video service authorization for the political subdivisions of Rush Hill, Gower, Maysville, Plattsburg, Edgerton, Hamilton, and Lathrop have expired and shall be removed from Allegiance's video franchise service area.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Allegiance Communications, LLC's video service authorization is amended by the expiration of and removal of video service in the Rush Hill, Gower, Maysville, Plattsburg, Edgerton, Hamilton, and Lathrop political subdivisions.

2. This order shall become effective on May 30, 2013.
