STAFF RECOMMENDATION

COMES Now the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission and submits its Recommendation as follows:

- 1. On December 5, 2013, Allegiance filed a request to postpone the termination of the above-listed political subdivisions. On March 26, 2013, Allegiance Communications, LLC, filed a status report indicating the Company will continue to serve Rushville, Missouri, but would like to renew their request to postpone termination of Gower, Maysville and Plattsburg, Missouri. Allegiance also indicated the termination of the remaining Video Service Authorizations would be acceptable.
- 2. Section 67.2685 provides that a video service shall expire upon notice to the Commission that the holder of the authorization will cease to provide service under that authority.

WHEREFORE, the Staff recommends the Commission recognize the expiration of the video service authorization in those political subdivisions in which Allegiance notified the Commission it will no longer serve.
