ORDER APPROVING TARIFFS

On January 23, 2002, Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE filed a revised tariff sheet to revise its current tariffs to make all rate schedules interim subject to refund after April 1, 2002, pursuant to the terms of a final non-appealable order to be issued in this case. The tariff bears an effective date of February 22.

On February 8, the Commission's Staff filed a Memorandum in which it recommended the Commission approve the tariffs. Staff stated that the tariffs comply with the Commission's order issued January 3 requiring AmerenUE to file tariffs making rates charged on and after April 1 subject to refund. Staff also stated that the tariff was filed in a timely manner, and is as agreed to by Staff and AmerenUE in the Jointly Filed Revised Procedural Schedule.

The tariff sheet accurately reflects AmerenUE's commitment and complies with the Commission's order issued January 3, and the Commission will approve it. The revised tariff sheet reflects AmerenUE's commitment, in the event that its rates are lowered in this case, to make those lower rates effective April 1. The tariff does not allow AmerenUE to collect higher amounts effective April 1 in the event that rates are raised in this case.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:


