## **MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER** AND MOTION FOR EXTENSION TO FILE DIRECT TESTIMONY

COMES NOW UtiliCorp United Inc. ("UtiliCorp" or "Company") d/b/a Missouri Public Service ("MPS"), in accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.085, and, for its motion for issuance of the Missouri Public Service Commission's ("Commission") standard-form protective order and its motion for extension to file direct testimony, states as follows:

- Pursuant to the procedural schedule issued by the Commission, direct testimony is 1. due to be filed today, January 29, 2002. In making final preparations for the filing of UtiliCorp's direct testimony, UtiliCorp has determined that a protective order has not previously been issued by the Commission in this case.
- 2. The Company seeks to provide in testimony, and may be asked through data requests, to provide competitive pricing information and technical, financial and business information of a confidential or proprietary nature. Additionally, it is anticipated that other information which may be requested or utilized in testimony by the Staff, as well as the Office of the Public Counsel ("OPC"), may contain customer-specific information, competitive pricing information, trade secrets and confidential, technical, financial and business information, or other material of a confidential or proprietary nature. Public disclosure of the referenced material which the Staff, OPC, or others may seek in discovery may tend to harm the interests of the Company, its employees and its customers. None of the information for which a claim or confidentiality will be made can be found

in any format in a public document.

- 3. Therefore, because there is a potential for public disclosure of confidential or proprietary information without a protective order in place, the Company moves the Commission to issue in this case its standard-form protective order containing classifications of "highly confidential" and "proprietary."
- 4. Additionally, because direct testimony is otherwise due today, UtiliCorp requests that the date for filing direct testimony be extended until such time as the Commission has ruled upon the motion for protective order.
- 5. Counsel for UtiliCorp has discussed this matter with counsel for the Staff and OPC and neither party objects to a grant of these motions.

WHEREFORE, the Company, pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.085, respectfully requests that the Commission:

- (a) grant an extension for the filing of direct testimony until such time as the Commission has ruled upon the motion for protective order;
- (b) issue the Commission's standard-form protective order containing classifications of "highly confidential" and "proprietary" to guide the parties' conduct in this case; and,

(c) grant such further relief as the Commission deems appropriate.
