7	Q. Please state your name and business address.	
8	A. Byron Murray, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.	
9	Q. By whom are you employed and in what capacity?	
10	A. I am a Regulatory Economist III in the Tariff/Rate Design Unit of the	
11	Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission").	
12	Q. Are you the same Byron Murray that previously filed testimony in Staff's	
13	Report Responding to Certain Commission Questions in this case?	
14	A. Yes.	
15	Q. What is the purpose of your rebuttal testimony?	
16	A. The purpose of my testimony is to respond to the Direct Testimony of	
17	Mr. Martin Hyman of the Division of Energy regarding Mr. Hyman's concern that	
18	Plug-In Electric Vehicle Time of Use (PEV-TOU) rate for residential customers would	
19	require a separate meter.	
20	Q. On page 5 of Mr. Hyman's direct testimony he mentions a space heating	
21	tariff, does Ameren Missouri have a tariff specifically for space heating customers?	
22	A. No. Ameren Missouri does not have any tariffs regarding a specific end	
23	use. However, Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCPL") has a residential general	

use tariff and a residential space heating or all-electric tariff. KCPL also has a separately metered residential space heating tariff, which is frozen to any new customers.

Q. Mr. Hyman implies in his testimony that a PEV-TOU rate would require that Electric Vehicle Charging Station EVCS charging be separately metered. Is this accurate?

A. No, a separate meter is not required in order to offer a PEV-TOU rate. For example, KCPL's all-electric tariff is for customers whose electric usage, space heating and other end uses are served on one meter. Staff's recommendation that Ameren Missouri design a residential PEV-TOU tariff in addition to Ameren Missouri's current TOU tariff is similar to the KCPL example in that KCPL has a tariff for its all-electric residential customers.

- Q. Does this conclude your testimony?
- A. Yes it does.
