

Proposed Amendment

4 CSR 240-123.070 Monthly Report Requirement for Registered Modular Unit Dealers. The Commission is amending sections (3), (4), and the Authority.

PURPOSE: This amendment sets forth the inspection fee the Missouri Public Service Commission, Manufactured Housing and Modular Units Program can assess dealers.

- (3) The director of the Manufactured Housing and Modular Units Program may reject monthly sales reports that are incomplete, and require dealers to submit corrected reports. An inspection fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per report may be assessed for each report that is submitted 60 days after the due date.
- (4) Failure to submit timely and complete monthly sales reports **and/or to pay any required fees** could result in suspension or revocation of the dealer's registration under section 700.100, RSMo.
