Dear Mr. Roberts:

This letter is being submitted for filing in this case in accordance with the provisions of §386.210 RSMo. Aquila, Inc. ("Aquila"), d/b/a Aquila Networks-MPS, Aquila Networks-L&P and Aquila Networks, caused to be filed with the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Commission") on April 14, 2004, a compliance tariff in the referenced case in accordance with the Commission's April 13, 2004, Order Approving Stipulation and Agreement (the "Order"). Tariffs applicable to Aquila Networks-MPS operations were filed utilizing that trade name. Tariffs applicable to Aquila Networks-L&P operations were filed utilizing that trade name. Common tariffs applicable to the operations of both divisions were filed simply under the name "Aquila Networks."

Subsequently, the tariffs were rejected by the Commission. The apparent reason for the rejection of the tariffs was the utilization of the fictitious name (i.e. Aquila Networks).

On the morning of Wednesday, April 21, 2004, Dennis R. Williams, Vice-President Regulatory Services for Aquila Networks visited the Commission's offices in Jefferson City, Missouri and discussed the issue of the tariff rejection with Commissioners Gaw and Murray. The purpose of the discussion was to seek guidance on whether the company should file tariff sheets at variance with the Order and, if so, how to go about doing so. Mr. Williams discussed with Commissioners Gaw and Murray the wording of the Commission's Order directing the filing of the tariffs "in the form of the tariff sheets included with the Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement." I am advised that although the topic was discussed, no resolution was reached at the time of the above-described communication.
