As your letter correctly noted, our 2014 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) shows that Ameren Missouri anticipates the need for 400 megawatts of wind energy. We have started the process to add the first 100 megawatts of that wind. Many factors went into selecting when and where that development will occur. However, it does not appear that our first 100 megawatts of wind energy will be located in Schuyler County. But I want you to know that this does not mean wind will not be located in Northeast Missouri. We still forecast a need for an additional 300 megawatts of wind energy, which we will likely source from multiple sites. We will be reviewing these projects in the near future, including those in Schuyler County. Ameren Missouri is definitely committed to wind as an energy resource.
