Dear Chairman Davis:

You may have occasion to see news reports of a court case involving Southern Union Company in Rhode Island. That case began more than four years ago when a facility that is no longer owned by Southern Union was vandalized. The vandals broke into a storage facility using baseball bats and crowbars, stole liquid mercury and spilled it at an apartment complex in Providence, Rhode Island. The vandals were convicted of various crimes, and Southern Union spent millions of dollars on a cleanup, for which it was commended by the Governor of Rhode Island, yet was subsequently charged with violation of environmental laws. On October 15, 2008, a jury found Southern Union not guilty on two of the three charges brought by the government. The company was found guilty on a single count for failure to have an environmental permit. Southern Union Company has motions pending before the court to dismiss that count, and expects to be fully exonerated. Please let me know if you have questions or need additional information.
