STAFF MOTION TO SUSPEND TARIFF

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, by and through counsel, and for its *Motion to Suspend Tariff* in this matter hereby states:

- 1. On April 10, 2015, Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri ("Ameren Missouri" or "Company") submitted a tariff sheet revising its rates for natural gas service, bearing an effective date of May 10, 2015. According to Ameren Missouri, the purpose of the revision is to reflect the results of its annual reconciliation of the Company's Infrastructure System Replacement Surcharge (ISRS). The Company states that its reconciliation shows an under-recovery, and therefore the tariff sheet reflects an increase in the residential sales customer class' monthly ISRS charge. The tariff has been assigned Tracking No. JG-2015-0298 and is attached here as Appendix A and incorporated by reference.
- 2. A gas utility's ISRS revenues are subject to refund based on a finding and order of the Commission, to the extent provided in subsections (5) and (8) of Section 393.1015 RSMo.¹
- 3. Subsection 5(2) of Section 393.1015 RSMo and Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-3.265(17) require that at the end of each 12-month calendar period the ISRS is in effect, the gas corporation shall reconcile the differences between the revenues resulting from an ISRS and the appropriate pretax revenues as found by the

commission for that period "and shall submit the reconciliation and a proposed ISRS adjustment to the commission for approval to recover or refund the difference, as appropriate, through adjustments of an ISRS charge."

- 4. In Case No. GO-2014-0015, the Commission determined that Ameren Missouri should be allowed to recover annual ISRS surcharge revenues of \$1,266,546. Ameren Missouri filed a compliance tariff, which the Commission approved in an order that took effect on October 18, 2013.
- 5. As explained in the cover letter to Ameren Missouri's reconciliation filing in this matter, the Company calculated the reconciliation for the 12-month calendar period of mid-October 2013 to October 2014.
- 6. Typically, gas utilities have included ISRS reconciliations along with petitions to change ISRS surcharges by adding newly installed eligible infrastructure system replacements, and Staff has reviewed the reconciliation along with the rest of the ISRS application. With this filing, however, Ameren Missouri is not requesting approval to recover the costs for new eligible infrastructure system replacements, but rather to reconcile the difference between the revenues resulting from the ISRS and the appropriate pretax revenues as found by the Commission in GO-2014-0015. Ameren Missouri submitted its reconciled ISRS tariff sheet bearing an effective date 30 days from the date of filing.
- 7. The 30-day effective date will not allow Staff sufficient time to perform a review of Ameren Missouri's reconciliation and make a recommendation to the Commission. Therefore, Staff recommends the Commission suspend the tariff until

August 8, 2015, which is 120 days from the time Ameren Missouri filed its tariff.³ Staff also recommends the Commission order Staff to submit its recommendation regarding the tariff sheet and Ameren Missouri's ISRS adjustment no later than June 9, 2015, which is 60 days after Ameren Missouri filed its tariff.⁴

- 8. This suspension will allow Staff reasonable time to review Ameren Missouri's calculations and submit a recommendation to the Commission, and allow any other party sufficient time to respond to Staff's recommendation prior to a Commission order.
- 9. Staff counsel has discussed this motion with counsel for Ameren Missouri and the Office of the Public Counsel. Public Counsel stated that it supports Staff's motion, and Ameren Missouri stated that it does not object to Staff's motion.

WHEREFORE, Staff recommends the Commission issue an order suspending Ameren Missouri's tariff attached here as Appendix A until August 8, 2015, and issue an order directing Staff to submit its recommendation regarding Ameren Missouri's filing in this matter no later than June 9, 2015.
