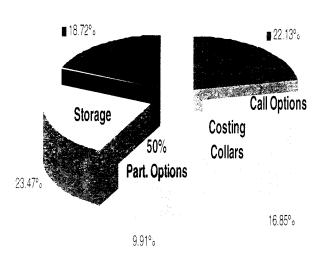

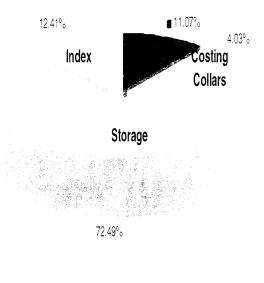

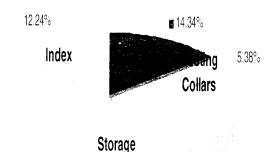

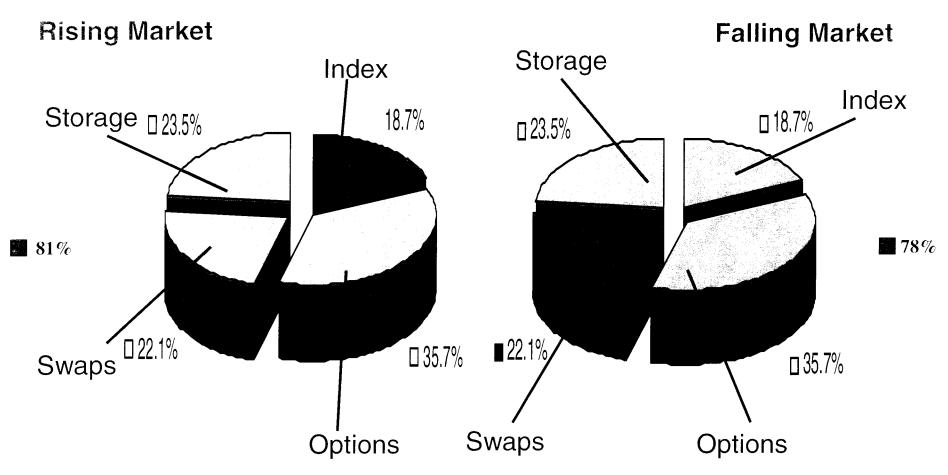

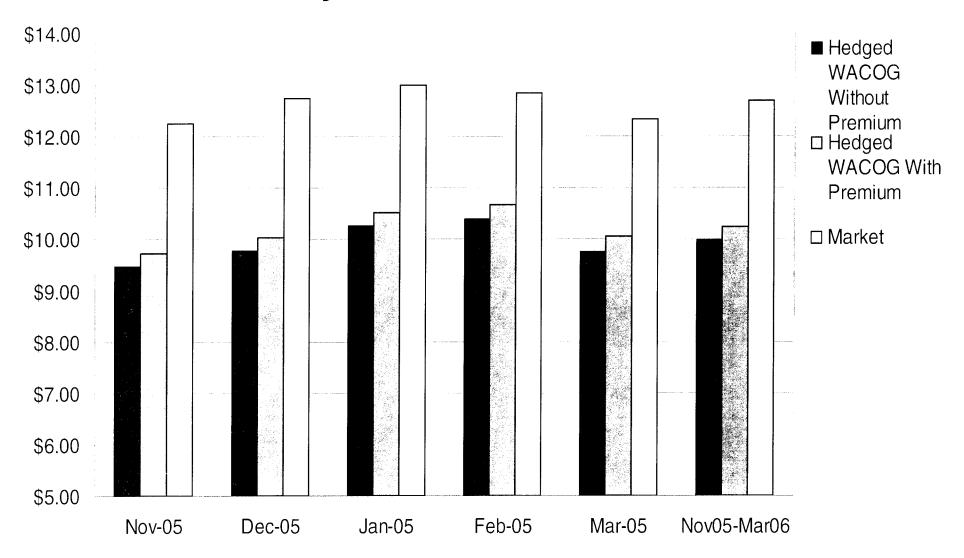
### Exposure under changing conditions

- Higher than WACOG

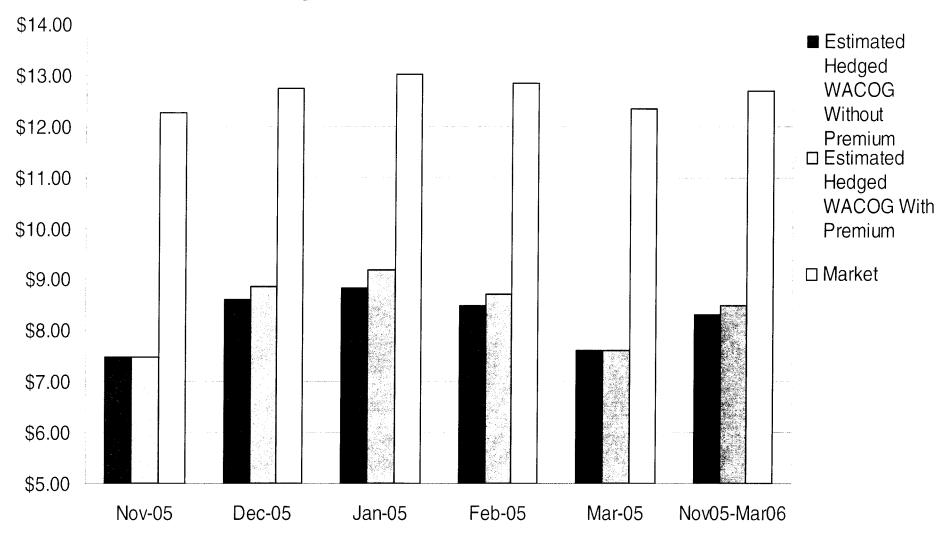


# Projected WACOG compared to Market – MPS Southern System as of 09/19/05 NYMEX Close



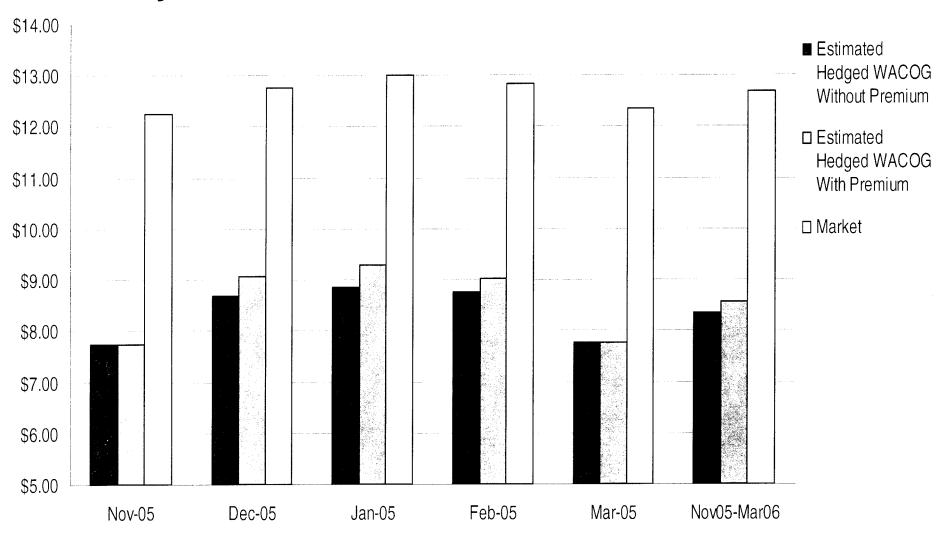


# Projected WACOG compared to Market – MPS Northern System as of 09/19/05 NYMEX Close

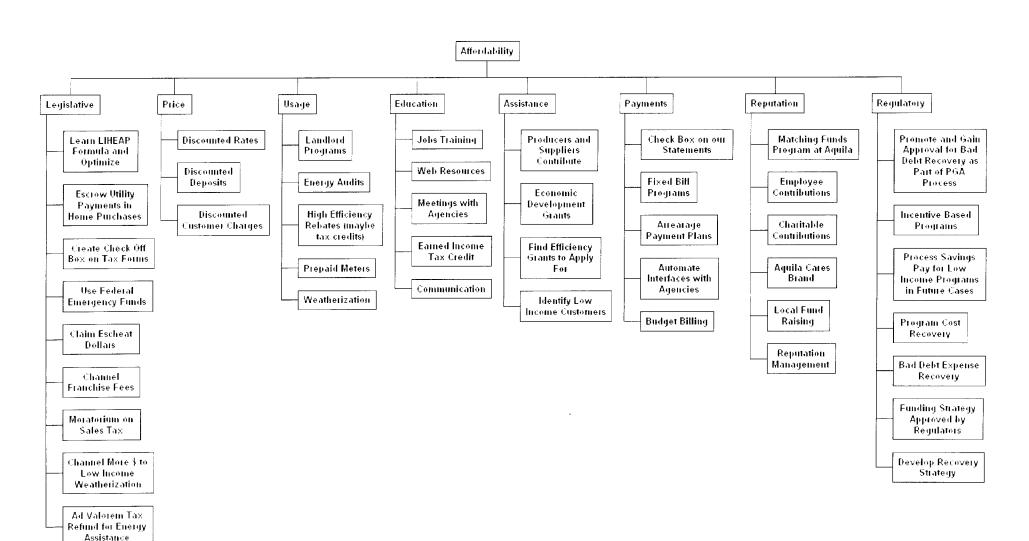

# **Expect Higher Heating Bilis This Winter**

#### Why are natural gas prices higher?

Who lessale matural gas prices have been rising because natural gas demand is increasing, particularly for gas-fueled power plants. Prices are affected by weather, too, if winter weather is cold, higher demand for natural gas will push prices up even more. Aquita does not profit from natural gas price increases. Customers pay what Aquita has aready paid for natural gas supplies - and not a penny more. Gas supply costs represent about 60% of your natural gas bill.

What is Aquila doing to reduce the effect of gas supply price increases? Aquila is committed to providing reliable natural gas service for customers at the test market prices available. The company uses a portioto approach when purchasing natural gas supplies - purchasing its normal winter gas requirements in late spring and obtaining up to 80% of its natural gas supply from fixed price contracts, gas placed in storage and options contracts. The

The Aquila Cares program provides money to local assistance organizations to help qualifying inclviduous pay their energy bills and for the cost of lepains to vital heading and cooling systems. Aquila donates up to \$100,000 annually for energy assistance – 50 cents for every distinct that outcomers contribute.

#### Act Now To Hold Down Your Heating Bills

Using energy wisely can help reduce your home heating obsts:

- Lower your furnace thermoctat setting by 10% to 15% for eight hours and cut annual heating costs as much as 10%.
- Use caulk or weather stripping to seal doors and windows: can reduce monthly energy bills as much as 10%.
- Have your furnace checked annually by a professional to be sure it's operating at top efficiency.
- Lower the water heater temperature a few degrees, and use cold water whenever possible.
- Take five-minute showers, not baths.
   Typically a shower uses 10 to 20 gallons of water, and a bath requires about 30 gallons.
- Check your furnace filter monthly and replace if needed.
- Keep shades, blinds and drapes open during the day closed at night.

### Aquila Cares Program

- Increased contribution from \$100,000 to \$500,000

### Summary

- Gas price increases are significant, and will present a real challenge for LDCs and their customers this winter
- Aquila's Gas Supply Portfolio has materially mitigated, but not eliminated, the impact of these increases
  - Forecast prices this winter to be approximately 21% higher than last year
- Aquila is taking action to directly and indirectly address this situation for our customers
  - Early and ongoing communications
  - Increased contribution to Aquila Cares program
