Dear Mr. Hubbs:

By Order dated January 29, 1989 in these cases, the Commission approved Kansas City Power & Light Company's application to sell its downtown Kansas City, Missouri, central station steam heat distribution system to Trigen-Kansas City District Energy Corporation (Trigen). KCPL's application specifically requested that KCPL's certificates of public convenience and authority respecting public utility steam service be revoked as of the date of closing of the sale.

KCPL and Trigen expect to execute the sales documents tomorrow morning, March 29. Counsel for both KCPL and Trigen will contact the Commission's General Counsel and confirm the document execution. Title to the steam system will not be transferred until Trigen's tariffs and rules have been approved and filed with the Commission, and KCPL's tariffs, rules and steam service certificates have been cancelled and revoked.

KCPL respectfully requests that the Commission issue an Order which simultaneously (a) approves Trigen's tariffs and rules, and grants Trigen a certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide steam service, as set forth in Trigen's filings, and (b) cancels and revokes all of KCPL's tariffs, rules and certificates of public convenience and authority related to its provision of public utility steam service.
