## NOTICE REGARDING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

On September 21, 1999, the Commission issued an order requiring the parties to file a proposed procedural schedule no later than October 28, 1999. That order stated: "The procedural schedule shall include dates for the filing of testimony and for a hearing." On November 4, 1999, the Commission extended the deadline to November 19, 1999.

On November 19, the Staff of the Commission, on behalf of all the parties, filed a proposed procedural schedule that did not include dates for either the filing of testimony or for a hearing. The Staff instead filed a pleading in which it listed a date on which it anticipates a draft stipulation to begin circulating among the parties, and proposed that briefs be filed after the stipulation is filed.

The Commission cannot establish a procedural schedule based upon the November 19, 1999 filing. If the parties file a stipulated set of facts, the Commission will establish a briefing schedule in accordance with the proposal in the November 19, 1999 filing.
