nonpetitioning party, SWBT, and that SWBT shall be permitted to file a response to the petition and any additional information it wishes.

In the relief requested in its petition, Covad asked the Commission to issue a protective order. However, Covad did not mention the request for protective order anywhere else in its petition, and it did not state any grounds justifying such an order. Therefore, the Commission is unable to grant the request at this time. Covad may, of course, apply by motion for a protective order at any time. Such a motion should show that there is a need to protect proprietary or confidential information and that the request for a protective order is reasonable.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. That the Records Department of the Missouri Public Service Commission is ordered to serve notice of this petition upon Southwestern Bell Telephone Company.

2. That the request for a protective order made by DIECA Communications, Inc., d/b/a Covad Communications Company, is denied.

3. That Southwestern Bell Telephone Company shall be made a party in the instant action.

4. That Southwestern Bell Telephone Company shall file a response and any other information regarding this petition on or before November 10, 1999, with the Secretary of the Missouri Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, and send a copy to DIECA Communications, Inc., d/b/a Covad Communications Company.

5. That this order shall become effective on November 1,  
1999.
