**NOTICE OF DISMISSAL AND CLOSING CASE**

( On April 25, 2000, Donald S. McCandless, Jr. (Complainant) filed a complaint with the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) against Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCPL).

Complainant alleged in his complaint, *inter alia*, that KCPL erroneously billed him for services.

The Commission issued its notice of complaint on April 27, 2000, providing 30 days for KCPL to file an answer, or, in the alternative, to file a request for mediation.

( On May 26, 2000, the Complainant filed a notice of satisfaction of his complaint. The notice of satisfaction was in the form of a letter to the Commission. Complainant stated that KCPL and he had settled all

of the issues relating to this case. Complainant stated that accordingly, he was hereby withdrawing the complaint<sup>1</sup>.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) states, in part:

"...[A] complainant may voluntarily dismiss [a] complaint without an order of the commission at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered, by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission and serving a copy on all parties."

There has been no prepared testimony filed or oral evidence offered in this case, no party has asked for a hearing, and the Complainant's notice contained information showing that a copy thereof had been served on all parties.

Thus, the Commission takes notice of the dismissal of this case and it may be closed.
