NOTICE OF DEFICIENCY

On February 9, 1999, the Commission received from Cable & Wireless, Inc. (Company) what purported to be a petition seeking authority to change the corporation's name to Cable & Wireless USA, Inc. However, the document in question is not a petition or an application because it does not comply with the Commission's rules relating to such documents. Most importantly, the document in question is not signed by an attorney licensed to practice law in Missouri. See Regulations 4 CSR 240-2.060 and 4 CSR 240-2.080. Therefore, the Commission cannot act on Company's request until Company has made a sufficient filing with the Commission.

A regulated corporation seeking to change its name may pursue either of two courses. Under the first course, an attorney is unnecessary. The company addresses a letter to the Secretary of the Commission requesting that the name be changed, and including either an adoption notice and substitute tariff title page, showing the new corporate name, or tariff sheets with a thirty-day effective date. The

company must also enclose an appropriate certificate from the Missouri Secretary of State.

The second option is more formal. An attorney, licensed to practice in Missouri, must file an application on behalf of the corporation. The application must comply with the Commission's rules, as cited above. The application must be accompanied by a certificate from the Missouri Secretary of State and a tariff sheet with a thirty-day effective date.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That Cable & Wireless, Inc., shall, within ten (10) days of the effective date of this Notice, file appropriate documents supporting its request to change its corporate name with this Commission as outlined above.
 - 2. That this order shall become effective on February 26, 1999.
