FIRST AMENDED APPLICATION

JD Services, Inc., d/b/a American Freedom Network (Applicant), a Nevada corporation, files this verified First Amended Application, pursuant to Section 392.440, RSMo, respectfully requesting that the Missouri Public Service Commission (Commission) issue an order that:

- (a) grants Applicant a Certificate of Service Authority to provide Interexchange telecommunications services pursuant to Section 392.440 of the Missouri Revised Statutes.
- (b) grants competitive status to Applicant.
- (c) waives certain Commission rules and statutory provisions pursuant to Section 392.420, RSMo Cumm. Supp. 1992.

Concurrently herewith, Applicant has filed an Application for Merger Approval and submits this Application pursuant to 4 CSR 240-2.06(9). In support of its request, Applicant states:

1. The legal name and principal office or place of business of the Applicant are:

J D Services, Inc. 1890 South 3850 West Salt Lake City, UT 84104 (801) 972-4090

A copy of the Applicant's Articles of Incorporation, Certificate of Authority from the Missouri Secretary of State to transact business in Missouri, and Registration of Fictitious Name are attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

- 3. Applicant proposes to provide interexchange telecommunications services within Missouri including the sale of prepaid long distance services through Debit Phone Cards. Applicant proposes to provide service to prospective customers throughout the state of Missouri.
- 4. J D Services neither owns nor operates any switching, transmission, or other physical facilities in the state of Missouri. In other words, J D Services is a reseller of long-distance telephone service offered by facilities-based interexchange carriers, such as MCI and Global Crossing. J D Services will obtain inbound and outbound WATS and WATS-type services from interexchange carriers that are certified to render such service in Missouri. These services will in turn be resold to J D Services' customers who purchase its prepaid phone cards and other calling products.

The prepaid phone cards of J D Services offer a method of prepayment of long distance charges. End users will be able to buy the prepaid phone cards in various denominations from a variety of retail and other outlets. Each card will contain a 1-800 number and a unique identifying number. The prepaid phone cards may be used at most touchtone telephones. Callers will obtain access to the J D Services' system by dialing a conventional 800 or POTS number. As a call is placed, J D Services' preprocessor tracks the call and the costs associated with the call are deducted on a real time basis from the prepaid amount on the card.

Callers may add value to prepaid phone card at the termination of a call in order to continue use of the card. The caller receives notification when the remaining value of the prepaid phone card will only permit one additional minute of conversation time. Additional value can be added to a J D Services phone card by subsequently dialing a 1-800 number, speaking with a live operator, and providing a valid commercial credit card number. Thus if a caller wishes to continue using the same J D Services prepaid phone card for an extended period, he/she can easily do so by automatically adding value to the card.

J D Services proposes to offer prepaid phone cards on a wholesale and retail basis. The prepaid phone cards of J D Services will be available for purchase and distribution at various retail establishments, such as truck stops, restaurant chains, convenience stores, shopping clubs, hotels, or gas stations. J D Services will also market its prepaid phone cards to a variety of groups, such as businesses whose employees travel or associations whose members have a common interest. Prepaid phone cards sold on a retail basis will be prepaid. J D Services also plans to market its prepaid phone cards directly to wholesale distributors who will be able to use their own private labeling on the prepaid phone card. Prepaid phone cards sold on a wholesale basis will be either prepaid or invoiced.

J D Services will offer universal origination and termination in the state of Missouri. Its service offerings will be ubiquitous.

5. As requested in the accompanying Application for Merger Approval, Applicant proposes to adopt the current filed tariff of J D Services, Inc., a Utah corporation. A copy of this Tariff is attached hereto as Exhibit 2.

- 6. Applicant requests classification as a competitive telecommunications company within the state of Missouri. Applicant believes that its proposed services will be subject to sufficient competition to justify a lesser degree of regulation. Granting of this application will allow greater price and service options for telephone users.
- 7. Applicant also requests, pursuant to Section 392.420, RSMo (Cum. Supp. 1992), that the Commission waive the application of the following rules and statutory provision as it relates to the regulation of the Applicant.

within the State of Missouri. Applicant also requests classification as a competitive

telecommunications company. In addition, Applicant requests a waiver of the above-referenced rules

and statutory provisions.



ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

<u>C320-98</u>

OF

J D SERVICES, INC.

The undersigned incorporators being natural persons more than eighteen (18) years of age acting as all of the incorporators of the above-named corporation (the "Corporation") hereby adopt the following articles of incorporation for the Corporation:

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of the Corporation shall be:

J D SERVICES, INC.

ARTICLE II

PERIOD OF DURATION

The Corporation shall continue in existence perpetually unless sooner dissolved according to law.

ARTICLE III

PURPOSES AND POWERS

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

- (a) To develop and market telephone communication services, long distance telecommunications services, and long distance air time, and to develop, buy, sell or process all types of telecommunications services, equipment, and products of any nature, together with any related business, entity, assets or venture engaged in such business.
- (b) To borrow money and to execute notes and obligations and security contracts therefor, and to lend any monies or funds of the Corporation and to take evidence of indebtedness therefor, and also to negotiate loans.
- (c) To guarantee the payment of dividends or interest on any other contract or obligation of any corporation whenever proper or necessary for the business of the Corporation in the judgment of its directors.
- (d) To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient, or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers therein named, or which shall at any time appear conclusive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Corporation, either as holders of or interested in any property, or otherwise; with all the powers hereafter conferred by the laws under which this Corporation is organized.

(e) To conduct any lawful business for which a corporation may be organized under the laws of the State of Nevada.

ARTICLE IV

AUTHORIZED SHARES

The Corporation is authorized to issue a total of 60,000,000 shares of stock, consisting of 10,000,000 shares of preferred stock, \$0.01 par value, and 50,000,000 shares of common stock having a par value of \$0.001 per share. The powers, preferences, rights, qualifications, limitations, or restrictions of the shares of stock of each class and series which the Corporation is authorized to issue, is as follows:

- (a) Preferred Stock. Shares of Preferred Stock may be issued from time to time in one or more series as may from time to time be determined by the board of directors. Each series shall be distinctly designated. All shares of any one series of the Preferred Stock shall be alike in every particular, except that there may be different dates from which dividends thereon, if any, shall be cumulative, if made cumulative. The powers, preferences, participating, optional and other rights of each such series and the qualifications, limitations, or restrictions thereof, if any, may differ from those of any and all other series at any time outstanding. Except as hereinafter provided, the board of directors of this Corporation is hereby expressly granted authority to fix by resolution or resolutions adopted prior to the issuance of any shares of each particular series of Preferred Stock, the designation, powers preferences and relative participating, optional and other rights, and the qualifications, limitations and restrictions thereof, if any, of such series, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the following:
 - (1) The distinctive designation of, and the number of shares of Preferred Stock which shall constitute, each series, which number may be increased (except as otherwise fixed by the board of directors) or decreased (but not below the number of shares thereof outstanding) from time to time by action of the board of directors;
 - (2) The rate and times at which, and the terms and conditions upon which, dividends, if any, on shares of the series shall be paid, the extent of preferences or relations, if any, of such dividends to the dividends payable on any other class or classes of stock of the Corporation or on any series of Preferred Stock and whether such dividends shall be cumulative or non-cumulative.
 - (3) The right, if any, of the holders of shares of the same series to convert the same into, or exchange the same for, any other class or classes of stock of the Corporation and the terms and conditions of such conversion or exchange;
 - (4) Whether shares of the series shall be subject to redemption, and the redemption price or prices including, without limitation, a redemption price or prices payable in shares of any class or classes of stock of the Corporation, cash, or other property and the time or times at which, and the terms and conditions on which, shares of the series may be redeemed;
 - (5) The rights, if any, of the holders of shares of the series upon voluntary or involuntary liquidation, merger, consolidation, distribution or sale of assets, dissolution, or winding up of the Corporation;
 - (6) The terms of any sinking fund or redemption or purchase account, if any, to be provided for shares of the series; and

- (7) The voting powers, if any, of the holders of shares of the series which may, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, include (A) the right to more or less than one vote per share on any or all matters voted on by the shareholders and (B) the right to vote as a series by itself or together with other series of Preferred Stock or together with all series of Preferred Stock as a class; on such matters, under such circumstances, and on such conditions as the board of directors may fix, including, without limitation, the right, voting as a series by itself or together with other series of Preferred Stock or together with all series of Preferred Stock as a class, to elect one or more directors of the Corporation in the event there shall have been a default in the payment of dividends on any one or more series of Preferred Stock or under such other circumstances and on such conditions as the board of directors may determine.
- (b) Common Stock. The Common Stock shall have the following powers, rights, qualifications, limitations, and restrictions:
- (1) After the requirements with respect to preferential dividends of Preferred Stock, if any, shall have been met and after the Corporation shall comply with all the requirements, if any, with respect to the setting aside of funds as sinking funds or redemption or purchase accounts and subject further to any other conditions which may be required by the laws of the state of Nevada, then, but not otherwise, the holders of Common Stock shall be entitled to receive such dividends, if any, as may be declared from time to time by the board of directors;
- (2) After distribution in full of the preferential amount to be distributed to the holders of Preferred Stock, if any, in the event of voluntary or involuntary liquidation, distribution or sale of assets, dissolution or winding up of the Corporation, the holders of the Common Stock shall be entitled to receive all the remaining assets of the Corporation, tangible and intangible, of whatever kind available for distribution to stockholders, ratably in proportion to the number of shares of the Common Stock held by each; and
- (3) Except as may otherwise be required by law or these articles of incorporation, in all matters as to which the vote or consent of stockholders of the Corporation shall be required or be taken, including, any vote to amend the articles of incorporation, to increase or decrease the par value of any class of stock, effect a stock split or combination of shares, or later or change the powers, preferences, or special rights of any class or series of stock, the holders of the Common Stock shall have one vote per share of Common Stock on all such matters and shall not have the right to cumulate their votes for any purpose.

(c) Other Provisions.

(1) The board of directors of the Corporation shall have authority to authorize the issuance, from time to time without any vote or other action by the stockholders, of any or all shares of the Corporation of any class at any time authorized, and any securities convertible into or exchangeable for such shares, in each case to such persons and for such consideration and on such terms as the board of directors from time to time in its discretion lawfully may determine; provided, however, that the consideration for the issuance of shares of stock of the Corporation having par value shall not be less than such par value. Shares so issued, for which the full consideration determined by the board of directors has been paid to the Corporation, shall be fully paid stock, and the holders of such stock shall not be liable for any further call or assessment thereon.

- (2) Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the board of directors providing for the issue of any series of Preferred Stock, no holder of shares of any class of the Corporation or of any security of obligation convertible into, or of any warrant, option, or right to purchase, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire, shares of any class of the Corporation, whether now or hereafter authorized, shall, as such holder, have any pre-emptive right whatsoever to purchase, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire shares of any class of the Corporation, whether now or hereafter authorized.
- (3) Anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding, any and all right, title, interest, and claim in and to any dividends declared or other distributions made by the Corporation, whether in cash, stock, or otherwise, which are unclaimed by the stockholder entitled thereto for a period of six years after the close of business on the payment date, shall be and be deemed to be extinguished and abandoned; and such unclaimed dividends or other distributions in the possession of the Corporation, its transfer agents, or other agents or depositories, shall at such time become the absolute property of the Corporation, free and clear of any and all claims of any person whatsoever.

ARTICLE V

LIMITATION ON LIABILITY

A director or officer of the Corporation shall have no personal liability to the Corporation or its stockholders for damages for negligence or breach of fiduciary duty as a director or officer, except for damages for breach of fiduciary duty resulting from (a) acts or omissions which involve intentional misconduct, fraud, or a knowing violation of law, (b) usurpation of Corporate opportunity, or (c) the payment of dividends in violation of section 78.300 of the Nevada Revised Statutes as it may from time to time be amended or any successor provision thereto.

ARTICLE VI

RESIDENT AGENT

The address of the Corporation's resident agent and registered office is 1475 Terminal Way, Suite E, town of Reno, county of Washou, state of Nevada. The name of its initial resident agent in the state of Nevada is Corporate Service Center. Either the registered office or the resident agent may be changed in the manner provided by law.

ARTICLE VII

AMENDMENTS

The Corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change, or repeal all or any portion of the provisions contained in these articles of incorporation from time to time in accordance with the laws of the state of Nevada, and all rights conferred on stockholders herein are granted subject to this reservation.

ARTICLE VIII

ADGPTION AND AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

The initial bylaws of the Corporation shall be adopted by the board of directors. The power to alter, amend, or repeal the bylaws or adopt new bylaws shall be vested in the board of directors, but the stockholders of the Corporation may also alter, amend, or repeal the bylaws or adopt new bylaws. the bylaws may contain any provisions for the regulation or management of the affairs of the Corporation not inconsistent with the laws of the state of Nevada now or hereafter existing.

ARTICLE IX

DIRECTORS

The governing board of the Corporation shall be known as the board of directors. The number of directors comprising the board of directors shall be fixed and may be increased or decreased from time to time in the manner provided in the bylaws of the Corporation, except that at no time, following the first annual meeting of the board, shall there be less than five nor more than eleven directors. The original board of directors shall consist of two persons. The name of each person who is to serve as a director until the first annual meeting of stockholders and until his or her successor is elected and shall qualify is as follows:



SECTION 2 RULES AND REGULATIONS

2.1. Application of Tariff

2.1.1.	This tariff contains the regulations and rates applicable to intrastate resale
	telecommunications Services provided by J D Services, Inc., d/b/a American
	Freedom Network ("JDS") for telecommunications between points within the state
	of Missouri. JDS' Services are furnished subject to the availability of products or
	facilities and subject to the terms and conditions of this tariff.

2.1.1.A. JDS may, from time to time, offer various Enhanced Services and information within the state of Missouri. Such Enhanced Services will be provided pursuant to contract and will not be governed by this tariff.

2.1.1.B. The Services of JDS are not part of a joint undertaking with any other entity providing telecommunications channels, facilities or Services, but do involve the resale of Message Toll Services (MTS) and Wide Area Telecommunications Services (WATS) of underlying common carriers who may be subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

2.1.1.C. The rates and regulations contained in this tariff apply only to the Services furnished by JDS and do not apply unless otherwise specified, to the lines, facilities, or Services provided by a local exchange telephone company or other common carrier for use in accessing the Services of JDS.

2.1.1.D. The Services of JDS are furnished to purchasers of JDS Calling Cards and authorized End Users. The purchase of a Calling Card or subscription to a Service makes available to the purchasing End User JDS' nationwide Services, including the intrastate Services offered under the terms and conditions of this tariff.

2.2. Use of Services

- For violation of any of the provisions of this tariff: 2.5.1.B.

- 2.10.2.A. The Company shall have verified that payment has not been received at any office of the Company, or at any office of an authorized collection agent, through the end of the period indicated in the notice; and
- 2.10.2.B. The Company shall have checked the End User's payment record on the day termination occurs.

2.14. Advance Payments

For End Users for whom the Company feels an advance payment is necessary, the Company reserves the right to collect an amount not to exceed one (1) month's estimated charges as an advance payment for Service. This will be applied against the next month's charges and, if necessary, a new advance payment will be collected for the next month.

2.15. Contested Charges

For consideration of any disputed charge, an End User may discuss the dispute with a customer service agent, who may adjust the JDS Calling Card balance as necessary. 3.3. Service Offerings

3.3.1. JDS Calling Card Service is a prepaid long distance Service offered to all End Users. Service is available twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days a week. Users may purchase JDS Calling Cards at a variety of retail outlets or through other distribution channels. Retailers may purchase direct from JDS or through wholesale distributors of JDS' products. A call is placed by dialing a 1-800 number to obtain access to JDS' network. The caller is prompted by an automated voice response system to enter his/her account number, and then to enter the terminating telephone number.

JDS' processor tracks the call duration and destination for rating purposes on a real time basis. The total price of each call, including applicable taxes, is deducted from the prepald amount on the caller's JDS phone card. When the balance on the card approaches zero, the caller is so advised, and, if desired, the caller may "recharge" the phone card by using a valid commercial credit card number.

JDS also offers private labeling to its End Users which allows businesses to purchase cards with custom designs, logos or print. These private label cards are used by the end user in exactly the same manner as other JDS prepaid phone cards.
