ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On January 30, 1987, the Commission issued an order granting MCI Telecommunications Corporation (MCI) a certificate of public convenience and necessity to provide intrastate intraLATA toll telecommunications services in Missouri. In the Report And Order the Commission required MCI to file PIU Reports for its interstate interLATA and interstate intraLATA traffic with the local exchange company (LEC). On February 27, 1987, the Commission issued an order temporarily staying the PIU reporting requirement.

On July 28, 1988, Commission Staff filed a memorandum recommending the Commission lift its stay since the issue of PIU reporting requirements for interexchange carriers (IXCs) was resolved in conjunction with the Primary Toll Carrier Plan approved in TO-84-222 et al. Under the Primary Toll Carrier Plan IXCs must report their intrastate intraLATA PIU to the LEC. The Primary Toll Carrier Plan was implemented July 1, 1988.

The Commission has reviewed this matter and has determined the temporary stay should be lifted and this case closed. The approval of the PIU reporting requirement in connection with the Primary Toll Carrier Plan makes the Commission's stay moot.

It is, therefore,

ORDERED: 1. That the temporary stay of the PIU reporting requirement is hereby lifted. MCI Telecommunications Corporation shall comply with the PIU reporting requirements ordered in TO-84-222, et al.

ORDERED: 2. That this case is hereby closed.

ORDERED: 3. That this order shall become effective on the date hereof.
