Dear Chairman Gaw, Commissioner Murray, and Commissioner Clayton:

WorldCom, Inc., now known as MCI, provides this informational notice to advise that it has asked the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for a 60-day extension to formally emerge from Chapter 11 bankruptcy. The extension is necessary to complete its filings with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), the last major task to be completed. MCI would be able to file and emerge at any time during the 60-day extension.

Great progress on the reconstruction of financial statements has been made. The 2002 10K, which includes restated financials for 2000, 2001 and 2002, is undergoing an extensive final review to ensure accuracy, quality and transparency. MCI also is working diligently on 2003 and is in the process of auditing the results and preparing the filings. Once its 2002 10K is filed, the company will submit its 2003 annual and quarterly reports to become a current filer with the SEC.

The Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors supports MCI's request for an extension and continues to support the Plan of Reorganization.

MCI has spent the past year building a world-class board of directors and executive management team and instituting a standard-setting corporate governance structure. As this financial process is completed, MCI remains focused on winning in the marketplace. MCI will continue to focus on its customers in Missouri, maintaining the highest level of customer service.
