- 3. Applicant proposes to provide switched and dedicated basic local exchange telecommunications service on a facilities and resold basis, throughout all exchanges within the state of Missouri presently served only by incumbent local exchange companies (ILECs) Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT), Sprint Missouri, Inc. d/b/a Sprint (Sprint) and GTE Midwest Incorporated (GTE). Applicant seeks authority to provide service in all exchanges of these ILECs as described in their basic local tariffs, in areas which follow the ILEC exchange boundaries and which are no smaller than an exchange. Digital Access will also provide data transmission services via high-speed, high quality data connections. Digital Access also seeks authority to provide the full range of nonswitched local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services to subscribers to and from all points in the State of Missouri.
- 4. Pursuant to this application, Digital Access seeks to offer several forms of basic local, nonswitched local exchange, and long distance telecommunications services. The Company will describe and provide rates for these services in the tariffs it will file with the Commission once its interconnection agreement or agreements are in place.

- 5. Digital Access possesses the technical and managerial expertise and experience necessary to provide the services it proposes. Description of the backgrounds of Applicant's management, which demonstrate Digital Access's extensive experience and expertise, are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit B. Applicant also possesses the necessary financial resources to provide its telecommunications services in the state of Missouri. In particular, Digital Access has access to the financing and capital necessary to conduct the telecommunications operations it seeks authority to provide by this application. During an initial transition period, Digital Access will rely upon the sizable financial assets of its parent company, Digital Access LLC, and its and its affiliate Digital Access, Inc., to ensure that it has sufficient capital to maintain its operations. - 7. Digital Access hereby agrees to offer basic local telecommunications service as a separate and distinct service in accordance with applicable law. Digital Access will give consideration to equitable access for all Missourians, regardless of where they might reside or their income, to affordable telecommunications services in Digital Access proposed service areas for basic local telecommunications services in accordance with applicable law.
- 8. Digital Access will comply with all applicable Commission rules and is willing to meet all relevant service standards, including, but not limited to billing, quality of service, and tariff filing and maintenance.

The above referenced rules and statutory provisions have been waived for other carriers in prior cases. Since Applicant is providing similar services as those companies who have been previously granted such waivers, Applicant respectfully requests waiver of the above referenced rules and statutory provisions, consistent with the principle of competitive equality.

9. Digital Access further requests a temporary waiver of 4 CSR 240-2.060(6)(C). This rule requires that an application for a certificate of service authority to provide interexchange, local exchange or basic local exchange service shall include in its application a proposed tariff with a forty-five day effective date. Digital Access finds it difficult at this time to develop tariffs to fully comply with this rule because, among other things, Digital Access has not yet executed or received Commission approval of any interconnection and/or resale agreements with incumbent local exchange companies. Applicant also desires to coordinate the timing of offering all of its services, and therefore

asks that the waiver of 4 CSR 240-2.060(6)(C) apply to its nonswitched local exchange and interexchange tariffs as well as its basic local exchange tariff. At such time as all facts necessary for the development of such tariffs are known to Applicant, it will promptly file said tariffs bearing no less than a 45-day effective date with the Commission in a manner consistent with recent Commission practice in similar cases.

10. The Commission has already approved numerous applications for companies proposing to provide competitive local exchange carrier ("CLEC") services in Missouri. Digital Access submits that the public interest will be served by Commission approval of this application because Digital Access's proposed services will create and enhance competition and expand customer service options in the local exchange marketplace and high-speed data market. Digital Access's certification as a CLEC will not have a negative impact on the prices, network design or financial viability of the incumbent LECs, the principal providers of local exchange services in Missouri. To the contrary, introduction of a new competitive entrant will promote the availability, affordability, and quality of exchange telephone services. The public convenience and necessity, therefore, will be served by the prompt approval of this application authorizing Digital Access to provide the services described herein.
