ORDER DIRECTING FILING

On February 23, 1996, the Commission adopted the recommendations of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission (Staff) relating to Kansas City Power & Light Company's (KCPL) 1995 LaCygne Unit #1 AQC fire. In compliance with the Commission's order issued on March 29, 2000, directing KCPL to file a status report, KCPL filed its compliance status report updating the Commission on the current status of its compliance with the recommendations related to the 1995 LaCygne Unit #1 AQC fire.

In its status report, KCPL noted that it had complied with the remaining directives of the Commission's order entered February 23, 1996. KCPL respectfully requested that this case be closed. The Commission would be aided by receiving a response from the Staff regarding KCPL's compliance with the Commission's February 23, 1996 order and KCPL's request to close this case. Therefore, the Commission will direct Staff to file its response to KCPL's compliance status report no later than June 30, 2000.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. That the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission shall file a response to Kansas City Power & Light Company's compliance status report concerning recommendations related to the 1995 LaCygne Unit #1 AQC fire filed April 18, 2000, and this response shall be filed no later than June 30, 2000.
 - 2. That this order shall become effective on June 12, 2000.
